This morning we enjoy the yarns and tales of the bush poets on stage, then later we visit the Harvey Dickson Country Music Centre to see WA's amazing collection of music memorabilia. There's more country music to enjoy throughout the day and tonight we have our own private entertainment with country music singer Donna Atkins. (B,D)

#### Day 4

After a delicious cooked breakfast and reminiscing of our wonderful weekend, we return to Perth via Donnybrook and Mandurah, stopping for morning tea and lunch on the way. (B)

## Dirk Hartog Island - Monkey Mia - 6 Days

#### Day 1

Departing Perth, we travel north to the Pinnacles, Jurien Bay, Port Denison and Dongara. (D)

#### Day2

We visit the HMAS *Sydney* Memorial in Geraldton, then on to Billabong and Shark Bay, visiting the stromatolites of Hamelin Bay and Shell Beach along the way before reaching Denham, Australia's most westerly town. (B,D)

#### Day 3

Today we visit Monkey Mia to see the popular wild dolphins that have been gathering in the waters off the beach for years. Later we visit "Ocean Park", an interactive aquarium, and visit Eagles Nest Boardwalk to spot sharks, Dugong and Manta rays. (B,D)



A cruise today on the Catamaran Aristocat, to explore Shark Bay and Dirk Hartog Island. Discover this amazing untouched World Heritage Area, watching dolphins, loggerhead turtles and dugongs. (B,D)

## Flinders Ranges Art tour with Ross Paterson – 9 Days

Mon 08 - Tue 16 Apr 2019

Visit and paint some of Australia's most beautiful landscapes in the Flinders Ranges. You'll be astounded at the ever-changing colours as we travel from location to location. Non-painters/photographers welcome too.

#### Day 1

Arrive in Adelaide where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours team. We drive straight to Port Augusta for "meet-and-greet" drinks and nibbles with our tutor and other passengers. (D)

#### Day 2

This morning we view the scenery atop the Matthew Flinders Lookout, before heading to the delightful historical town of Quorn for lunch and your first painting session. Ross will demonstrate how he tackles some of the subjects, and then it will be your turn to paint. Later we continue with a scenic drive to Merna Mora Station, your home for three nights. (B,D)

#### Day 3

A full day of painting around Merna Mora Station where you will have numerous choices of classic Flinders Ranges vistas to paint under Ross's guidance. The area is steeped in history with many artifacts and evidence of the early days of settlement. (B, D)

#### Day 4

We take a short drive to Parachilna Gorge, deep in the heart of the Flinders Ranges, with its huge river gums, red gums and amazing water courses. Ross will choose a location to paint and will do a demonstration to waken your artistic flow, and then you will have your turn. Picnic lunch provided today. (B,L,D)

#### Day 5

We pack our gear and head to Hawker for morning tea and a look at the very interesting Jeff Morgan Gallery. We continue to Rawnsley Park Station and after lunch you will have an afternoon painting session. Barbecue dinner tonight around a classic Aussie campfire. (B,D)

#### Day 6

A full day of painting at Blinman and surrounds. Blinman is the highest town in South Australia, set in the Flinders Ranges. The town began with the discovery of copper in 1859 and commencement of mining in 1862. It has some lovely old heritage buildings which we'll be able to paint, and after lunch we pack up and continue down the highway to the Cazneaux Tree which stands in a picturesque location. We have another quick painting session here before we head back to our accommodation. (B)



Ross Paterson is recognised as one of Australia's leading and influential watercolourists, oil painters and pastelists who is well-respected for his "en-pleinair" paintings in watercolour, oil, and pastel. A multiaward winner in Australia and internationally Ross is one of the few watercolourists invited to represent Australia in world Water Media expositions and Biennials and has had his work published in various books and publications worldwide.

## Day 7



We stay at Rawnsley Park Station today, painting more classic Flinders Ranges scenery. Ross will choose your location and after a demo on how to capture the scene in front you, you'll be free to paint for the rest of the day, stopping only for a bite of lunch. (B,D)

## Day 8

This morning we leave Rawnsley Park Station and make our way to Orroroo for morning tea, then its on to the historic copper mining town of Burra for lunch, check-in and an afternoon painting session. As it's our last night together, we'll have a show-and-tell of all the work we've created over the past week. (B,D)

## Day 9

After a hearty breakfast, we leave Burra, making our way to Adelaide airport through the wine regions of South Australia. What a grand way to finish an art trip of the Flinders Ranges! (B)



## Esperance – Bremer Bay at Easter – 5 Days

A tour exploring some of WA's most spectacular coastline. The Esperance region has some of the most spectacular landscapes in Australia including turquoise blue bays and picturesque islands of the Recherche Archipelago to the spectacular cliffs of the Great Australian Bight. Bremer Bay is also known for beautiful beaches, walk and drive trails, and underwater treasures.

## Day 1

We leave Perth and head south through Brookton to Hyden, Wave Rock, and the legendary Mulka's Cave. We have time to explore this unique area with lots of photo opportunities. Overnight in Hyden. (D) Entry to park included.

#### Day 2

On to Ravensthorpe, Esperance and Cape Le Grand National park this morning, visiting Lucky Bay, Rossiter Bay, Hellfire Bay, Le Grande Beach, and Thistle Cove. Later we visit Esperance's very own Stonehenge. (B,D)

#### Day 3

We start with a scenic and informative boat cruise to the nature reserve at Woody Island. Later we have free time in town, followed by a leisurely drive around the Great Ocean Drive, stopping at the famous Pink Lake. (B,D)

#### Day 4

We explore the Fitzgerald River National Park today, stopping at scenic lookouts to view rugged coastal scenery and numerous wildflowers. We continue to Bremer bay, known for its beautiful beaches, and whale watching between January and April. Hopefully we will get to see some of these creatures of the deep. (B,D)

We head to the farming communities of Katanning and Wagin, where we visit the "Big Ram" and the Wagin historical village. We continue through the towns of Narrogin and Brookton and arrive in Perth later in the afternoon. (B)

## Mt Augustus - Kennedy Range - 7 Days

Travel through classic outback territory with the highlight being Mt Augustus, one of the most spectacular monoclines in the world.

We head north through the Swan Valley, Bindoon and Dalwallinu, spotting wildflowers along the way, then continue to Payne's Find, Mount Magnet and Cue, our overnight stop. (D)

#### Day 2

On to Meekatharra, then we take the dirt road to Mt Augustus, stopping at the Murchison Riverknown for the famous Landor racetrack. Next stop is Mt Gould, site one of WA's oldest police stations. We continue to our accommodation at Mt Augustus Station, enjoying the changing beauty of Mt Augustus along the way. Dinner by campfire under the stars tonight. (B,D)

#### Day 3

Today we explore Mt Augustus, the lovely Lyons River, and Cattle Pool, viewing amazing large river gums and Aboriginal art on the rock. Later we travel to our sunset viewing area for drinks and nibbles whilst watching the sun go down on Mt Augustus, followed by another campfire dinner. (B,L,D)



#### Day 4

We travel the Cobra-Dairy Creek Road to the Kennedy Range, crossing the Gascoyne River and continuing through amazing cliffs and rocky countryside. We also visit Temple Gorge and Honeycomb Gorge. (B,L,D)

#### Day 5

Today we travel to Carnarvon, visiting the Quobba Blowholes, the Carnarvon lighthouse, jetty, the town and wharf area. (B,D)

#### Day 6

We visit the tracking station (set up by NASA to support the Gemini and Apollo space programs), and the OTC Satellite Earth Station Carnaryon, Later we visit White Bluff Lookout, then continue to Kalbarria National Park via the Murchison River. We have stops at Hawks Head and Ross Graham Lookout to take in the scenic gorge views. (B,D) Entry to Satellite Station included.

We spend quality time in each location, watching Leon demonstrate how to capture our beautiful surroundings in our art, and then having a go ourselves.

#### Day 1

Arrive in Alice Springs where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours team and transferred to your accommodation. Later we enjoy a meet-and-greet with our tutor and fellow artists, and our first dinner together. (D)

#### Day 2

An opportunity for an early morning balloon flight over the MacDonnell Ranges (own expense) before breakfast, then we spend all day painting the buildings and countryside at Alice Springs Telegraph Station. Leon will start with a demonstration of how he tackles the subject in front of him, followed by time for you to do your own painting. (B)

#### Day 3

Tutorial and painting at Simpsons Gap this morning, with Leon's guidance. Simpsons Gap is a stunning gorge carved out of the West MacDonnell Range and is a wonderful painting subject. Lunch at Glen Helen Homestead (our accommodation) followed by more painting and an opportunity for a helicopter flight over the gorge (own expense). (B,D)

#### Day 4

All day painting at Ormiston Gorge under your tutor's guidance, with endless subjects - the earthy orange gorge, crystal reflections, grand old gum trees, birdlife, wildlife and more. Ormiston Gorge is one of the most picturesque places on this tour and you will be amazed at the colours, reflections and textures around you.(B,D)

#### Day 5





Leon is a professional plein air and studio oil painter from Perth, Western Australia. His process involves sketches and quick oil studies before working on a more refined painting. Winner of numerous awards in Australia and internationally, he is highly respected amongst his peers and is regularly invited to exhibit and teach in the USA and Europe. Leon is also the founder of Plein Air Painters of Australia and is an ambassador for world leading art supply companies, Michael Harding Oil Paints and Rosemary and Co Brushes. Sharing his knowledge and teaching others how to paint outdoors from life is one of his passions. Don't miss this opportunity to learn how to create beautiful vivid art, full of colour, light and texture, not achievable if painted from a photo in the studio.

A full day of painting again, this time at Ellery Creek Big Hole. Thousands of years of massive floods have carved out this beautiful waterhole and unlocked some amazing geology (an artist's dream)! (B)

#### Day 6

This morning we travel to Ross River (stopping for morning tea in Alice Springs on the way). We enjoy lunch at Ross River Homestead and then in the afternoon Leon will set up his painting gear and demonstrate more painting techniques, painting our surrounds. (B,D)

## Day 7

A day of painting at the stunning Trephina Gorge, noted for its sheer quartzite cliffs, River Redgum lined watercourses, and wide sandy creek beds. Tonight we'll have a "show-and-tell" of the works everyone has created during this tour. It will be wonderful to see everyone's styles and subject choices. (B,L,D

#### Day 8

We part our ways today at Alice Springs airport, taking with us new painting skills and memories. (B)

## Adelaide to the Red Centre - 10 Days

Sat 01 to Mon 10 June 2019

\$3,630 (seniors \$3,480) S/Supp \$680

Discover the spectacular scenery of our Red Centre, and be amazed by the size of our iconic Uluru and the beauty of the nearby Kata Tjuta. Explore historical Alice Springs and the stunning MacDonnell Ranges, and marvel at the Coober Pedy "moonscape".

#### Day 1

We begin in Adelaide, home of festivals and food, arts and culture. We visit the Mount Lofty Summit, which provides spectacular panoramic views across Adelaide's city skyline to the coast. The peak rises more than 710m above sea level. Later you can enjoy a ride on "Popeye" on the Torrens River (own expense) for a different look at the city or immerse yourself in the culture of Adelaide's North Terrace, before being transferred to your accommodation. (D)

## Day 2

We begin our day by travelling to Port Pirie. Smelters have been in operation here since 1889, and it became the biggest lead smelter in the world by 1934. We have a town tour then free time to explore this quaint little town, then continue to Port Augusta, situated on the Spencers Gulf. Whilst here we visit the Wadlata Centre, where you can take a journey back in time learning about South Australia and the Flinders Ranges. (B,D)

#### Day 3

We start the day by visiting Mathew Flinders Lookout in the Arid Botanical Garden, and then continue on to Lake Gairdner, the largest salt lake in South Australia. We follow the highway to Woomera, famous for its RAAF Woomera Range Complex (a large systems testing range covering an area of approximately 122,000 sq kms). In the afternoon we reach Coober Pedy, our home for two nights. (B,D)

#### Day 4

We spend the day in Coober Pedy today. Coober Pedy mines over 92% of Australian opals and you have a chance to buy your very own opal today during our town tour, when you will also find out more about the unique practice of opal mining. In the late afternoon we travel to the breakaways for pre-dinner drinks and nibbles whilst watching a magical sunset. (B,D)

#### Day 5

Travel to Uluru and Kata Tjuta today, visiting Mt Conner and Lake Amadeus along the way, having a stop at the 1-million acre cattle property at Curtin Springs. We arrive at Yulara where you will have time to visit the town Centre before checking in to our accommodation and enjoying the amazing art installation—Field of Lights by international artist Bruce Munro at the Rock in the evening (own expense). (B)

#### Day 6

Today is all about the "Rock" and the "Olgas". We enjoy a very information tour with a local guide, before having the opportunity to explore the area and visit the Cultural Centre . You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to the "Rock" for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset in the evening. (B,D)

#### Day 7

Leaving Yulara today, we continue our journey to Kings Canyon in the Watarrka National Park. We take a walk into the Gorge, marvelling at its breathtaking 100m high walls. We return to our accommodation, then after settling in we view a beautiful sunset over the Watarrka National Park. (B,L,D) Note: Helicopter flight opportunity over Watarrka National Park (own expense).

#### Day 8

On to Alice Springs where we visit the historic Telegraph Station and Anzac Hill Lookout before a visit to the stunning Simpson's Gap, returning via Honeymoon Gap. Overnight in Alice. (B)

#### Day 9

Today we visit the amazing Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. Several waterholes attract native wildlife and provide a beautiful setting for visitors. We continue to Ross River Homestead for lunch. The appeal of Ross River lies in the truly remarkable N'Dhala Gorge Nature Park which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. Ross River Resort is the historic Loves Creek Homestead built in 1898 by the pioneering Bloomfield family as a working cattle station. Return to Alice in the afternoon. (B,L,D)

#### **Day 10**

We head to town for some last minute shopping and a last look around this outback town, before being transported to the airport for flights home, after an amazing journey to the Red Centre. (B)

## **Kimberley Dreaming – 9 Days**

Wed 12 to Thu 20 June 2019

\$3,780 (Seniors \$3,630) S/Supp \$750

Explore the stunning scenery of Western Australia's popular Kimberley region. It is bordered on the west by the Indian ocean, on the north by the Timor Sea, on the south by the Great Sandy and Tanami Deserts, and on the east by the Northern Territory. Massive boab trees dotting the landscape, rugged mountain ranges, dramatic gorges, semi-arid savannah and a largely isolated coastline will keep you mesmerized, and the variety of wildlife will keep your cameras clicking. Keep an eye out for crocs!

#### Day 1

After our flight to Kununurra we begin right away with a visit to the very interesting Zebra Rock Gallery where you can buy some of your very own zebra rock, and try their famous mango smoothie. Later we share drinks and nibbles with fellow passengers before dinner. (D)

#### Day 2

Today we travel along the Gibb River Road to Zebedee Hot Springs where you can enjoy a dip in the thermal springs. We continue into El Questro station and have lunch with our fellow passengers, then continue to Emma Gorge for an afternoon stop before heading back to Kununurra. (B)

## Day 3

You have the opportunity for an early morning flight over the Bungle Bungle Range and Lake Argyle (own expense). After breakfast we enjoy a lovely cruise up the Ord River to Lake Argyle, spotting crocodiles and birdlife along the way. At the dam wall you are met by our driver and taken to the lookout for stunning views of the lake and river. Overnight at Lake Argyle Resort. (B,D)



#### Day 4

Sightseeing from the air this morning by helicopter for views over the Lake Argyle area and the Carr Boyd Ranges. We also visit the iconic Durack Homestead, and enjoy a cruise on the lake. (B)

#### Day 5

We head to Warmun, formerly known as Turkey Creek, for morning tea, then continue on to the town of Halls Creek, our stop for the night. (B,D)

#### Day 6

We start with a trip to historic Old Halls Creek, the site of the first gold discovery in WA, then visit the white quartz "China Wall". Later we enjoy a stop at Mary River for afternoon tea before continuing to Fitzroy Crossing, our stop for the night. (B,D)

#### Day 7

Today we travel to Tunnel Creek, made famous by the Aboriginal warrior Jandamarra. Tunnel Creek features a 750-metre tunnel which has worn through the Napier Range. We also visit the 3.5 km Windjana Gorge (spot the freshwater crocodiles)! (B,L,D)

# Kakadu – Litchfield National Parks - 7 Days

Mon 24 to Sun 30 June 2019

\$3,090 (Seniors \$2,940) S/Supp \$550

Visit two of the most popular and picturesque national parks in Australia. Kakadu has been home to Aboriginal people for more than 65,000 years and is dual World Heritage-listed for its outstanding natural and cultural values; and Litchfield is home to stunning waterfalls, crystal clear pools, and iconic magnetic termite mounds. A magical place to visit!

#### Day 1

Fly to Darwin via Broome, where you are greeted by your Aussie Redback crew and transferred to your accommodation for a meet and greet over dinner. (D)

#### Day 2

We travel to Litchfield National Park, home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into crystal clear pools (and where you can take a plunge at beautiful Wangi falls). We also visit the incredible Magnetic Termite Mounds, built by thousands of termites. We spend most of the day exploring the park, and tonight we stay in Batchelor. (B,D)

#### Day 3

Today we travel to Adelaide River and visit one of Australia's most famous war cemeteries and heritage listed WWII 4RSU Pell Airstrip. Later we return to bachelor to explore the townsite, visit Butterfly House, and the Batchelor Museum. (B,D)

#### Day 4

We visit Kakadu National Park today, the largest national park in Australia, covering almost 20,000 square kilometres (nearly half the size of Switzerland)! This biodiverse nature reserve has wetlands, rivers and sandstone escarpments, and is home to some 2,000-plant species and wildlife including saltwater crocodiles and flatback turtles. Aboriginal rock paintings dating to prehistoric times can be viewed at sites such as Nourlangie, Nanguluwur and Ubirr. We stay here for two nights. (B,D)

#### Day 5

We spend more time in Kakadu today, enjoying a cruise on Yellow Water, spotting crocs, magpie geese, eagles and more. We also visit Warradjan Aboriginal Cultural Centre, learning about Aboriginal culture, then and now. (B)

Later we hop on board an Adelaide River cruise, where the highlight is the jumping crocodiles! Return to Darwin in the evening. (B,D)

After a town tour and some free time you will be transferred to the airport for your flight back to Perth (R)





#### Day 1

Today we fly to Broome. After a town tour and motel check-in we enjoy a relaxing evening meal at Cable Beach whilst watching the sun go down. (D)

#### Day 2

We travel to Willare Bridge, then Fitzroy Crossing, stopping for boab photos and an afternoon cruise on Geikie Gorge. (B,D)

#### Day 6

We cross the border to the Northern Territory, passing through open woodland, grass understory, rocky outcrops, kapok trees and the floodplain of the Victoria River system. Later a sunset cruise on the Victoria River, spotting crocodiles along the way. (B,D)

We continue to Katherine and take a refreshing dip in the natural thermal springs at Katherine River. (B,D)

We spend a full day in and around Cooktown visiting the Botanical Gardens, the James Cook Museum, the lookout on Grassy Hill, and taking a river cruise on the Endeavour River in the afternoon. (James Cook Museum and cruise included in fare) (B)

We continue our journey through the Barrons Range to the Peninsula Development Rd, stopping for morning tea at the Split Rock Art Site, home to prehistoric rock paintings. We continue to Laura and Musgrave which was first built as an overland telegraph station in 1887, along with Palmerville, Fairview, Coen, Mein, Moreton, McDonnell and Paterson. Coen is our stop for the night. (B,D)





#### Day 5

Coen has an amazing array of birdlife with representatives from rainforest, monsoon forest and coastal forests. Keep your eyes open to spot these creatures of the forest. We travel over the Archer River and arrive in Weipa for a 2-night stopover. (B,D)

#### Day 6

Weipa comprises two townships and is on Albatross Bay at the confluence of Mission and Embley Rivers. It faces the Gulf of Carpentaria on the west side of Cape York Peninsula. The tranquil surroundings will transport you into a spiritual world of culture and history. Discover waterways and diverse wildlife including saltwater crocodiles and numerous bird species.

#### Day 7

Today we head to Fruit Bat Falls, one of far north Qld's most iconic watering holes, and as the tip gets nearer the journey becomes increasingly beautiful. We travel through the Heathlands Resource Reserve and cross the Jardine River on the vehicle ferry and then to Bamaga. In the afternoon we arrive in Seisia for a 3-night stopover. (B,L,D)

#### Day 8

Today we take the final slow drive through thick forest to the northern-most point of Australia named by James Cook on 21 August 1770. We drive as far as we can but then have to walk out over the rocks to the tip. 160km away across the Torres Strait is New Guinea. We return to Seisia to celebrate reaching the tip of Australia! (B,D)

#### Day 9

We take the ferry to Thursday Island, the administrative and commercial centre of the Torres Strait Islands set up in 1877. Since then TI has been a pearling centre and defence base during WWII. We visit the WWII tunnels and emplacements, and then the afternoon is free before we return to the mainland. (B,D)



#### Day 10

We head to Bramwell Station, stopping to look at the WWII plane wreck site just past Bamaga, before arriving back at the Jardine River Crossing. We continue to Bramwell Station, Australia's most northern cattle station. (B,D)

#### Day 11

This morning we travel to the Moreton Telegraph Station, on the banks of the Wenlock River. We continue through Archer River, Coen and onto Laura, an important supply centre for the gold rush towns of Palmerville and Maytown in the 1870s. This will be our stop for the night. (B,D)

#### **Day 12**

This morning we follow the Laura Heritage Trail from the centre of town where you will get a feel for those early years. Relics from the era remain, and you can visit the old Laura homestead to experience the confinement of an early police lock up. We continue to Lakelands, Palmer River, Mareeba and Cairns, stopping along the way. We arrive back in Cairns, settle into our accommodation and then enjoy our last meal together. (B,D)

#### Day 6

With our local guide we travel out to the opal fields and discover the many hidden gems of this fascinating town. Karijini National Park is an iconic, unspoiled nature-based destination offering a unique landscape and an unforgettable WA outback experience. It is famous for its dramatic creeks, spectacular gorges and towering sheer sided chasms up to 100 metres deep. We spend most of the day here with the opportunity to swim before heading back to Tom Price for the night. (B,L)

#### Day 6

We travel the Nanutarra — Munjina road to Nanutarra roadhouse with time to sight the Ashburton River on the way. On the North West Coastal Highway then, heading towards Coral Bay. The scenery changes and we will spot large termite mounds and coastal vegetation. Overnight in the popular coastal town of Coral Bay. (B)

#### Day 7

This morning we enjoy a fascinating cruise of the Ningaloo Reef in a glass bottom boat, then after lunch we head to Carnarvon, where we take in some of the town attractions before arriving at our accommodation. (B,D)

#### Day 10

Departing Kalbarri, we travel to Geraldton to visit the *HMAS Sydney* memorial before lunch. We take the Indian Ocean Drive home via Dongara returning to Perth later in the afternoon. (B)

#### Day 1

After arriving in Adelaide, you are transferred to Murray Bridge to begin your art and nature-lovers cruise. Tonight there's a pre-dinner drink for everyone to get to know one another, before a delicious hot dinner. (D)

#### Day 2

After a cooked breakfast, Terry will commence with a lesson on the basics of how to mix greens, perspective, and tonal values. Lunch is served on board and you can continue to paint as we meander upriver to Mannum, a very historic town on the west bank. We moor here for the night and you can purchase your dinner at the Pretoria Hotel, just a few metres away from our houseboat. (B,L)

After breakfast and a lesson on skies, cliffs and trees, we continue to cruise upriver and put the lesson into practise. Terry will provide one-on-one instruction if you need it. We stop along the way to spend time on land, then continue cruising past Younghusband, Teal Flat, and Lake Carlet, mooring for the night at the little settlement of Bowhill. You can continue painting on board or stretch your legs with a walk and sketch on land before our dinner on board. (B,L,D)



## Day 4

We depart Bowhill and head back downstream. Terry will provide a lesson on water and reflections which will help you sketch those special water scenes on this cruise. We spend time on land, capturing more of the beauty of the Murray River, paying attention to reflections from the boat and our surroundings, water colours, ripples and shapes. We moor at the small settlement of Younghusband with its riverside shacks, picturesque views and abundant birdlife. It will be hard to choose what to sketch! (B,L,D)

#### Day 6

After a scrumptious cooked breakfast, we have time for more sketching under Terry's guidance. We continue to cruise past the never-ending delights of the Murray River, capturing more of its beauty on paper. Later Terry will show you how to paint a sunset (before the sun goes down). You'll get a chance to paint your own sunset right after that as we watch our last sunset on the Mighty Murray! More show-and-tell of our work tonight after our last dinner together. (B,L D)

#### Day 7

Today we return to Murray Bridge and leave our houseboat behind. We drive to the German town of Hahndorf for lunch and a bit of shopping before your transfer to Adelaide for your flight home. (B)

#### Day 3



If Tasmania is on your must-do list again, but you want to see more, then this journey offers more than the usual trip around the Island. We have included Bruny Island — a wildlife haven of jagged cliffs and golden beaches swirling with seabirds; Stanley — set in a region aptly names the 'Edge of the World'; and the famous Tahune Airwalk — an elevated walkway 30 metres above the forest floor which has spectacular views to the peaks of the World Heritage Area.

#### Day 1

Arrive in Hobart to meet your Aussie Redback Tours crew and transferred to your accommodation for a good night's sleep, before our wilderness adventure starts.

#### Day 2

Today we take a short drive to Kettering to catch the ferry to Bruny Island for a two-night stopover. The home of the beautiful South Bruny National Park, Bruny Island provides the ultimate Tasmanian wilderness experience. The stunning coastline of the island is home to fur seals, fairy penguins, and white wallabies, and provides excellent opportunities for birdwatching, not to mention the abundance of seafood and wine. (B,D)

#### Day 3

On this day we take a cruise around Bruny Island, alongside some of Australia's highest sea cliffs, drifting up close to listen to the awesome 'Breathing Rock', entering sea caves, and passing through the narrow gap between the coast and 'The Monument. The "Made on Bruny Island" gourmet trail is another very special reason why we have visited the Island. (B)

#### Day 4

Today we leave the Island and visit the Tahune Airwalk, sharing the lives of the forest giants from up-close, looking down to the place where the wild waters of the Huon and Picton Rivers mingle. Later we continue to Southport, known as Australia's southernmost settlement. Here we spend a lazy two night stop over. (B,D)

#### Day 5

Departing Ida Bay Station, we travel through the most pristine southern-most Tasmanian bush, where peaceful Lake Lune River meets the ocean, and you will travel on one of the most iconic railways in history. The two-hour journey from the Ida Bay Station to the Elliott's Beach next to the Recherche Bay is a must. Free time later in Southport. (B,D) Train ride included on fare.

#### Day 6

We travel through Dover, Oatlands and Campbell Town, before arriving in Launceston, with stops on the way to explore. (B,D)

#### Day 7

This morning in the heart of Launceston, we visit the beautiful City Park, featuring magnificent mature shrubs and trees, many of English origin, before an afternoon on the water to explore the magical Tamar River and Cataract Gorge on-board the Tamar Odyssey. (B)

Stanley is a town of perfectly preserved colonial buildings, all sheltering in the imposing shadow of the Nut, an immense flat topped, volcanic plug rising 150m straight up from the water's edge. In the afternoon we visit the Stanley Museum, then there's free time to explore. (B,D)

#### Day 10

We travel to Arthur River this morning and enjoy a cruise on the MV George Robinson — a beautiful old steel-hulled vessel fitted out with Tasmanian timber and brass. Magical reflections of the lush vegetation in the tannin coloured river, and pristine densely forested river banks of myrtles, blackwoods, leatherwoods, sassafras, silver wattles and endangered Brooker's gums will keep you spellbound. At Turk's Landing, you will be captivated by the giant brown top stringybark (Tassie Oak) and the ancient giant tree ferns. On board we enjoy morning tea and a BBQ lunch, before returning to Stanley. (B,L)

#### **Day 11**

Departing Stanley we return to Hobart, stopping on the way at Deloraine and Historic old Ross, a tranquil village offering an amazing opportunity for visitors to experience the beauty and drama of Tasmania's colonial history. Later we arrive in Hobart for our last night together. (B,D)

#### Day 12

You have some free time in the city before your transfer to the airport for your flight home. (B)



Chan will commence with a demonstration, followed by one-to-one advice as you work on your own paintings. (B,D)

#### Day 6

Today we paint in the Freycinet National Park. Yesterday we saw the granite peaks from the distance – today we get closer. You'll be able to paint the peaks, the beach, and secluded bays today. Nice and relaxing. (B)

#### Day 7

We drive to Hobart today for a short painting session at the Salamanca Marketplace (no markets on today which is a good time to paint the surrounding buildings usually obscured by people and stalls).
