

Adelaide to the Red Centre

Mon 18 - Wed 27 May 2020 (10 days)

\$3,730 (seniors \$3,580) S/Supp \$750

Discover the spectacular scenery of our Red Centre and be amazed by the size of our iconic Uluru and the beauty of the nearby Kata Tjuta. Explore historical Alice Springs and the stunning MacDonnell Ranges, and marvel at the Coober Pedy "moonscape".

Day 1

We begin in Adelaide, home of festivals and food, arts and culture. We visit the Mount Lofty Summit, which provides spectacular panoramic views across Adelaide's city skyline to the coast. The peak rises more than 710m above sea level. Later you can enjoy a ride on "Popeye" on the Torrens River (own expense) for a different look at the city or immerse yourself in the culture of Adelaide's North Terrace, before being transferred to your accommodation. (D)

Day 2

We begin our day by travelling to Port Pirie. Smelters have been in operation here since 1889, and it became the biggest lead smelter in the world by 1934. We have a town tour then free time to explore this quaint little town, then continue to Port Augusta, situated on the Spencers Gulf. Whilst here we visit the Wadlata Centre, where you can take a journey back in time learning about South Australia and the Flinders Ranges. (B,D)

Day 3


We start the day by visiting Mathew Flinders Lookout in the Arid Botanical Garden, and then continue on to Lake Gairdner, the largest salt lake in South Australia. We follow the highway to Woomera, famous for its RAAF Woomera Range Complex (a large systems testing range covering an area of approximately 122,000 sq kms). In the afternoon we reach Coober Pedy, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 4

We spend the day in Coober Pedy today. Coober Pedy mines over 92% of Australian opals and you have a chance to buy your very own opal today during our town tour, when you will also find out more about the unique practice of opal mining. In the late afternoon we travel to the breakaways for pre-dinner drinks and nibbles whilst watching a magical sunset.

Day 5

Departing Coober Pedy we take the Stuart Highway stopping at various attractions along the way such as Mt Connor and Lake Amadeus before arriving at the million acre cattle station of Curtin Springs, our stop for two nights. (B,D)





Day 6

Today is all about the "Rock" and the "Olgas". We enjoy a very informative tour with a local guide, before having the opportunity to explore the area and visit the Cultural Centre . You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to the "Rock" for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset in the evening. (B,D)

Day 7

Leaving Curtin Springs today, we continue our journey to Kings Canyon in the Watarrka National Park. We take a walk into the Gorge, marvelling at its breathtaking 100 m high walls, then to our accommodation, then after settling in we view a beautiful sunset over the Watarrka National Park. (B,L,D) Note: Helicopter flight opportunity over Watarrka National Park (own expense).

Day 8

On to Alice Springs where we visit the historic Telegraph Station and Anzac Hill Lookout before a visit to the stunning Simpson's Gap, returning via Honeymoon Gap. Overnight in Alice. (B,D)

Day 9

Today we visit the amazing Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. Several waterholes attract native wildlife and provide a beautiful setting for visitors. We continue to Ross River Homestead for lunch. The appeal of Ross River lies in the truly remarkable N'Dhala Gorge Nature Park which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. Ross River Resort is the historic Loves Creek Homestead built in 1898 by the pioneering Bloomfield family as a working cattle station. Return to Alice in the afternoon. (B,L,D)

Day 10

A later start today, before being transported to the airport for our flights home, after an amazing journey to the Red Centre. (B)

Alice Springs to the Top End

Sat 30 May to Mon 09 June (11 days)

\$3,990 pp (seniors \$3,840) Single Supp \$850 pp

The Australian outback has to be experienced to be believed, and on this tour we visit many of NT's most popular attractions.

Day 1

Arrive in Alice Springs where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours team. There's a short stop in town before heading to our accommodation for check-in, meet-and-greet drinks and nibbles, and dinner. (D)

Day 2

Today we visit the amazing Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, waterholes, red river gums and sandy creek bed. We continue to Ross River Homestead for lunch. This is the historic Loves Creek Homestead built in 1898 by the pioneering Bloomfield family as a working cattle station. We return to Alice in the afternoon. (B,L,D)

Day 3


On to Simpsons Gap in the MacDonnell Range, part of an important spiritual site to the Arrarnte Aboriginal people, then later we visit Ormiston Gorge. Within the towering red walls of the gorge is a permanent waterhole which attracts all kinds of birdlife and animals. We return to Alice in the late afternoon. (B,D)

Day 4

Today we head north to Aileron, Barrow Creek and the interesting Karlu-Karlu (Devils Marbles) with enough time to explore along the way. Overnight at Tennant Creek. (B,L,D)

Day 5

Still travelling north, we visit the eccentric Daly Waters Historic Pub for a refreshing beer and lunch. We continue to Mataranka where we visit the replica of the original Elsey Homestead, used in the filming of 'We of the Never Never'. You can also take the palm-lined walkway for a swim in the famous thermal springs. Overnight in Katherine. (B,D)

This morning we visit the Adelaide River Cemetery then continue to Litchfield National Park, home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into crystal clear pools. We'll stop at the amazing Termite Mounds before arriving at Wangi Falls for a relaxing swim before arriving at Batchelor. (B,D)

Day 9

In to Darwin today for a tour of Battery Point,
The Port and the City Centre. We visit the Darwin
Museum - depicting the events of cyclone Tracey
in 1974; and the East Point Military Museum depicting the bombing raids on Darwin in 1942. Free
time tonight in the city for shopping and dinner.
Note: East Point Museum included. (B)

Day 10

Today we head to Adelaide River for a "Jumping Crocs" cruise! Later we visit Windows on the Wetlands - a Northern Territory Govt operated interpretive centre. On the way back to Darwin we call into Humpty Doo Rice Fields and Fogg Dam, a very interesting story of the Top End's past. (B,D)

Day 11

Your holiday concludes this morning after breakfast. You will be transferred to Darwin airport for your flight home. (B)

Day 6

We enjoy an early morning cruise through Katherine Gorge in Nitmiluk National Park. Discover the cultural significance of the first two gorges to the traditional landowners, the Jawoyn people and keep an eye out for the resident crocodiles. Later we continue to Kakadu National Park for a cruise on the famous Yellow Water Billabong. You'll see a variety of birdlife such as sea eagles, brolgas and little kingfishers, along with estuarine crocodiles basking in the muddy shallows. We spend the night in Kakadu. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we visit Ubirr and view Aboriginal rock art dating back some 20,000 years. Climb to the top of this rocky outcrop for spectacular views over the flood plains and escarpment country, a location you may recognise from the famous Australian film, Crocodile Dundee. Later we make our way to Adelaide River. (B)



Darwin + Tiwi Islands

Fri 12 to Wed 17 June 2020 (6 days)

The friendly local characters and magnificent landscapes you'll encounter on this Top End journey will leave you spellbound. Cruise waterways teeming with wildlife and immerse yourself in the culture of the traditional Aboriginal owners of the lands we are visiting.

Day 1

You will arrive at Darwin airport where you will be met by your Aussie Redback Term and transferred to your accommodation for five nights. (D)

Day 2

Into Darwin for a full tour which which includes Battery Point, the Port and the city centre. We also visit the Darwin Museum; depicting the events of cyclone Tracey in 1974 and the East Point Military Museum; depicting the bombing raids on Darwin in 1942. Later there's free time in the city for shopping and dinner. Note: Museums included in fare. (B)

Day 3

Today we travel deep into Kakadu for a cruise on the famous Yellow Water Billabong. You should see a stunning variety of birdlife such as sea eagles, brolgas and with any luck, fascinating little kingfishers. You'll see feared estuarine crocodiles too, basking in the muddy shallows, and later we'll visit Noarilangie and view Aboriginal rock art dating back some 20,000 years. If you climb to the top of this rocky outcrop you'll get spectacular views over the flood plains and escarpment country. (B,D)



Day 4

The Tiwi Islands are a must-do and today we take the ferry across to Wurrumiyanga. We will be greeted by the local people and our cultural experience begins. From the ferry landing, you'll wander up to the Tiwi Design art centre for a traditional 'Welcome to Country' smoking ceremony including totem dances. After a short morning tea break your local Tiwi guide will then show you through the Patakijiyali Museum where you will learn about the culture and history of the Tiwi People. The rest of the day is free to explore before we ferry back across to the mainland. (B,D)

Day 5

Litchfield National Park is a must see if you're in the Top End. It's home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into crystal clear pools, iconic magnetic termite mounds and clusters of weathered sandstone pillars at the Lost City. Feel yourself unwind as you float in lush waterholes with misty waterfalls nestled among dramatic landscapes. This afternoon we travel to Adelaide River for a cruise to watch the famous jumping Crocodiles. Tonight we'll enjoy a sunset dinner cruise on Darwin harbour. (B,D)

Day 6

This morning you'll have some free time in town before being transferred to the airport for your flight home. (B)

Day 1

You will be met at Darwin airport around midday by your Aussie Redback Tours team. We head straight to Adelaide River and Mount Bundy Station to check in to our accommodation for the next three nights. Once settled, we'll enjoy pre-dinner drinks and nibbles with Leonie and fellow artists and travellers. (D)

Day 2

Today we drive into Litchfield National Park, home to waterfalls, termite mounds and The Lost City. We'll spend time at Florence Falls and Wangi Falls where Leonie will show you how she captures the sights around her, and then it will be your turn to do the same till it's time to pack up and head back to our accommodation for dinner. (B,D)

Day 3

Today we stay at Mount Bundy Station and take in the beauty of the area. Leonie will decide where we are going to sketch today. The choices are endless. (B,D)

Day 4

We head to Katherine via Pine Creek today, stopping for morning tea, lunch, and a sketching opportunity in the historic area of Pine Creek. We continue on and stay at Katherine for two nights. (B,D)

Day 5

An early morning start with a cruise on Katherine Gorge, followed by a full cooked breakfast back at the Visitors Centre in Nitmiluk National Park. We return to Katherine for lunch then in the afternoon we spend time at the Springvale Homestead (the oldest station in the Northern Territory) for some lovely sketching opportunities. (B)

Day 6

We leave Katherine and travel the Kakadu Highway, stopping at Mary River Roadhouse for morning tea, then continue through to Kakadu National Park, famous for rock art, galleries, birdwatching, and spectacular scenery. We spend two nights at Kakadu Lodge, set in tranquil tropical surrounds. This afternoon there is time for some painting before dinner. (B,D)

Day 7

Today is all about Kakadu National Park. We find a special place in the park to set up and enjoy for the day, sketching the beautiful surroundings. We also visit Bowali Visitors Centre for an insight into what makes Kakadu National Park so spectacular, and there is also an opportunity to take a scenic flight over the Park (own expense). (B)

Day 8

Departing Kakadu, we travel the Arnhem Highway, stopping at Windows on the Wetlands for another painting opportunity. For half of the year the wetlands are flooded, while in the dry season they are baked and dried out. The region is one of great contrast. The wetlands are the highest point on the Adelaide River. In the afternoon we return to Darwin for our last night, dining at the Darwin Sailing Club, known for its spectacular sunsets. (B,D)



Day 9

After an amazing tour of Litchfield and Kakadu National Parks, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight home. (B)

Darwin To Broome

Thu 02 July – Mon 13 July 2020 (12 days)

From Darwin in the top end to Broome in the west, join us on this scenic tour through the Northern Territory to the Kimberley. Stunning scenery, majestic gorges, and vast rivers make this tour a "must-do".

Day 1

Fly into Darwin where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours crew. We take an afternoon tour of the city, then enjoy time at the famous sunset Mindil Beach markets before check-in at our accommodation and enjoying our first dinner together. (D)

Day 2

Today we explore Darwin. We visit the Darwin Military Museum, stroll through the Darwin Botanic Gardens, and enjoy free time in the city before an afternoon sunset dinner cruise on Darwin Harbour. (B,D)

Day 3

Travelling south on the Stuart Hwy today, we stop at Adelaide River's poignant War Cemetery. This afternoon we continue via Katherine to Nitmiluk National Park, where a tranquil cruise along the spectacular Katherine Gorge will allow you to sense the spirituality of the land. Catch glimpses of wildlife and learn about the history and culture of the local traditional owners, the Jawoyn people. Overnight in Katherine. (B,D)





Day 4

Watch the landscape transform dramatically today as we journey across vast pastoral leases and Aboriginal homelands into Western Australia. Later we enjoy a sunset cruise on the stunning Victoria River. Overnight in Timber Creek. (B,D)

Day 5

We travel to Lake Argyle today and visit the historic Durack Homestead, built in 1895. This afternoon and evening is free time to relax, purchase your own dinner and enjoy this amazing area of the Kimberley. Optional helicopter flight over Lake Argyle and the Ord River dam (own expense). (B)

Day 6

This morning we explore the rugged northern end of Lake Argyle, with an informative commentary on a morning cruise of the lake. In the afternoon we cruise the Ord River to Kununurra, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 7

Today you may choose an optional early-morning scenic flight over the spectacular Bungle Bungles before a short drive to Wyndham and the Five Rivers Lookout. We also visit Parry's Lagoon — a haven for birdlife, crocs, brolgas, and jabirus. Overnight in Kununurra, and free time to purchase your own dinner tonight. (B)

Day 8

We travel to the remote township of Fitzroy Crossing this morning, stopping en route at Halls Creek. This afternoon we cruise with a local guide through magnificent Geikie Gorge, watching for freshwater crocodiles, fruit bats, and wallabies as the 30-metre walls of the gorge tower above us. (B,D)

Day 9

Today we travel through spectacular landscapes en route to the former pearling outpost of Broome, and our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 10

Enjoy a town tour with your Aussie Redback crew, visiting the fascinating Japanese Cemetery and nearby Gantheaume Point. In the afternoon we relax together with a drink while the sun sets over Cable Beach. (B,D)

Day 11

Today is yours to explore this tropical hideaway. Take an optional tour to Willie Creek Pearl Farm or visit the Malcolm Douglas Croc Farm, or maybe just visit Chinatown and the local pearl shops. It's your day to do what suits you. (B,D)

Day 12

Broome to Cairns – Savannah Way

Wed 15 July to Friday 31 July 2020

The Savannah Way is Australia's adventure drive, linking the pearling town of Broome in Western Australia's Kimberley to **Cairns in Tropical North Queensland** via the natural wonders of Australia's tropical savannahs and the Northern Territory's Top End.





Day 1

You will be met in Broome by the Aussie Redback Tours team. After a town tour and motel check-in we enjoy a relaxing evening meal at Cable Beach whilst watching the sun go down. (D)

Day 2

We travel to Willare Bridge, then Fitzroy Crossing, stopping for boab photos and an afternoon cruise on Geikie Gorge. (B,D)

Day 3

On to Halls Creek, site of the first gold discovery in WA. We see the "China Wall", a natural vein of sub-vertical white quartz rising to 6m above the surrounding country in places. (B,D)

Day 4

We travel to Warmun for a chance to fly over the Bungle Bungles (own expense). From here we travel to Kununurra, in the heart of the Kimberley. We visit the Ord River diversion dam and Ivanhoe Crossing which was originally part of the main Kununurra to Wyndham road. (B,D)

Day 5

An optional morning cruise up the Ord River to Lake Argyle (own expense), spotting crocodiles and birdlife before reaching the dam wall, which holds back the equivalent of 21 Sydney Harbour waters. Later we stop at a lookout for a stunning view over the lake and Ord River. Tonight, you have time to relax and swim in the Infinity Pool before dinner. (B,D)

Day 6

We cross the border to the Northern Territory. passing through open woodland, grass understory, rocky outcrops, kapok trees and the floodplain of the Victoria River system. Later a sunset cruise on the Victoria River, spotting crocodiles along the way. (B)

Day 7

We continue to Katherine and take a refreshing dip in the natural thermal springs at Katherine River. (B,D)

We start the day with a cruise at Nitmiluk Gorge. See mist rising above the smooth water's surface, hear the wildlife stirring from the night and breathe the crisp clean air in this stunningly beautiful spot. Later we travel to the famous Mataranka thermal pools and then our accommodation for the night. (B)

Day 9

We travel to Elsie Station cemetery, then famous Daly Waters Pub. In the past the pub has witnessed murders, shoot outs, and stampeding cattle! Later we stop at historic Newcastle Waters Station in the Barkly Tablelands. Overnight Tennant Creek. (B,D)

Day 10

On to Barkly Homestead, then over the Queensland border to Camooweal to visit the Drovers Camp Heritage Centre. (B,D)

Day 11

We continue to Mt Isa and Cloncurry. At Cloncurry we visit the John Flynn museum and Mary Kathleen Memorial Park. We later enjoy drinks and nibbles before our evening meal. (B,D)

Day 12

On to Normanton today, stopping at the Burke and Wills Roadhouse, arriving in Normanton early afternoon. Later we drive to Karumba on the Gulf of Carpentaria for a fish and chips dinner and one of the most amazing sunsets you will ever see. (B,D)

Day 13

On to Forsayth today, followed by an afternoon cruise on Cobbold Gorge, Queensland's youngest gorge. (B,D)

Day 14

We travel to Mt Surprise and Georgetown, which boasts some of the best gemstone areas, and one of the finest attractions in Queensland - the Ted Elliott Mineral Collection at TerrEstrial. We also visit the Cumberland Chimney (B,D)

We continue to Cairns, stopping for a tour of the Undara Lava Tubes at the Undara National Park on the way. (B,D)

Day 16

We visit Port Douglas; Kuranda - the well-known arts and crafts village in the rainforest; and have free time in Cairns. (B,D)

After a hearty breakfast, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight home. (B)



Historic Outback Towns - Cairns to Perth

Mon 03 August to Wed 19 August 2020 (17 days)

Endless outback history, rainforests, stockmen's tales, gemfields and star-filled night skies.

Day 1

Arrive in Cairns where you will be met by the Aussie Redback Tours team and transferred to your accommodation. (D)

Day 2

This morning we take a scenic train ride to the rainforest village of Kuranda. On the way you will experience the magic of Barron Falls as your train meanders through the rainforest before arriving at Kuranda. Ample time to explore before the opportunity to descend the mountain in the purpose-built cable car (own expense) where you will be met by your crew. Free time in the afternoon to explore Cairns. (B)

Day 3

Departing Cairns, we travel through the Atherton Tablelands, stopping at Ravenshoe (the highest town in Qld). We continue on the Kennedy Hwy, crossing the Great Dividing Range and arriving in Charters Towers mid-afternoon. After dinner tonight we enjoy "Ghosts After Dark", a film screened in the amphitheatre of Towers Hill. As the film suggests, the ghosts of the past have a starring role. (B,D)

Day 4

Still crossing the Great Dividing Range, we travel through several national parks on our way to Clermont, which lies near the impressive Peak Range Park. We continue to Emerald which contains the largest sapphire gemfields in the world. (B,D)

Day 5


Today we visit the town of Sapphire, named after the beautiful blue gemstones which have been found here since the late 1800s. Later we travel on to the towns of Barcaldine and Longreach. (B,D)

Day 6

We start the day with a visit to the Stockman's Hall of Fame, followed by free time to visit the QANTAS museum, and ride on a stagecoach before we head off for our afternoon cruise and show on the Thompson River. (B,D)

Day 7

More historic towns today, starting with Blackall which is nestled on the banks of the mighty Barcoo River. We continue on to the outback towns of Tambo and Augathella, arriving in iconic Charleville in the late afternoon. (B,D)

Day 8

Today we travel to Cunnamulla, a little town created by Cobb & Co in 1879 when the first coach drove through from Bourke. We visit the 'Fella from Cunnamulla', and then travel through to Bourke, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 9

We have a full day in Bourke today, visiting the Back O' Bourke Exhibition Centre, and enjoying an afternoon cruise on the Darling River on board the river boat PV Jandra. (B)

Day 10

This morning we head to Cobar, a mining town for over 100 years, then continue on the Barrier Hwy to Broken Hill, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 11

This morning we explore Broken Hill - 'The Silver City' - before heading to nearby Silverton, which has starred in countless films, television shows and commercials. We have our evening meal at the Silverton Hotel. (B,D)

Day 12

We continue on the Barrier Hwy to Peterborough, via Yunta, and the beautiful plains of rolled gold running to ancient ranges. Later we head to Port Augusta, through the majestic Flinders Ranges. (B,D)

Day 13

We follow the Flinders Hwy along the coast to the seaside towns of Elliston and Streaky Bay, stopping at Murphy's Haystacks on the way, then Ceduna, and stay the night at Nundroo. (B,D)

Day 15

Today we cross the famous Nullarbor Plain, checking out the Great Australian Bight and crossing the border into Western Australia. You'll spot camels, kangaroos, emus, and wombats along the way. Overnight at Cocklebiddy. (B,D)





We visit the D'Entrecasteaux National Park and Frankland National Park, enjoying views from above the forest floor on the spectacular Mt Frankland Wilderness lookout. Later we visit the Gap and Natural Bridge at Albany. (B,D)

Day 3

We explore the Southern Ocean area today, visiting Cheyne Beach on Two Peoples Bay, and Hopetoun for lunch. Later we follow the coastal road to Esperance, known for its snow-white beaches, stopping at Stokes National Park lookouts on the way. (B,D)



Day 4

A morning visit to Cape Arid National Park and the mouth of the Thomas River, then later to Cape Le Grande National Park's white beaches and rocky headlands. Free time in the afternoon, then an afternoon coastal drive on Twilight Beach Rd to see the magnificent blue water bays of Esperance. (B)

Day 5

Day 6

Our last day. We start by visiting Aboriginal paintings at Mulka's Cave, then unique Wave Rock. We continue to Kondinin, Corrigin, Quairading and York, arriving in Perth in the late afternoon. (B)

Mt Augustus / Walga Rock / Yalgoo

Sun 25 to Thu 29 Oct 2020 (5 days)

Visit Mt Augustus, the largest rock on the planet, and Walga Rock, a huge monolith where you can see the largest gallery of Aboriginal rock paintings in WA.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we travel through the Swan Valley and Bindoon to Dalwallinu, then on to the settlement of Paynes Find and Mt Magnet, spotting carpets of everlasting on the sides of the road on the way. We arrive at Cue, our overnight stop. (D)

Day 2

On to Meekatharra where we take the dirt road to Mt Augustus, stopping at Murchison River to collect firewood for our campfire tonight. We continue to Mt Gould, heritage site of one of WA's oldest police stations; and Landor Racetrack, where races have been held since 1929, arriving at Mt Augustus resort/ station in the afternoon for our two-night stay. (B,D) (Shared amenities)

Day 3

Today is all about Mt Augustus, Lyons River and Cattle Pool, where we have morning tea, a swim, and a look at Aboriginal art and rock formations. Free time to relax in the afternoon then later we enjoy champagne and nibbles whilst we watch the sun go down on the largest rock in the world. We finish the day with our evening meal around the campfire. (B LD)

Day 4

We say goodbye to Mt Augustus and make our way to the ruins of Big Bell, then Walga Rock, the second largest monolith in Australia (5 km around the base and 1.5 km long). We have a bush BBQ here then head to Cue for the night. (B,L,D)

Day 5

On to Yalgoo for morning tea and a visit to Jokers Tunnel, which was carved though solid rock by early gold prospectors. We arrive at Wubin for lunch before continuing our journey, arriving back in Perth in the late afternoon, (B)
