Kimberley Dreaming

Fri 03 Jul to Sat 11 Jul 2020 (9 days)

Explore the stunning scenery of Western Australia's popular Kimberley region. It is bordered on the west by the Indian ocean, on the north by the Timor Sea, on the south by the Great Sandy and Tanami Deserts, and on the east by the Northern Territory. Massive boab trees dotting the landscape, rugged mountain ranges, dramatic gorges, semi-arid savannah and a largely isolated coastline will keep you mesmerized, and the variety of wildlife will keep your cameras clicking. Keep an eye out for crocs!

Day 1

After our flight to Kununurra we begin right away with a visit to the Mirima National Park and Ivanhoe Crossing. Later we share drinks and nibbles with fellow passengers before dinner. (D)

Day 2

Today we take a tour to Wyndham, one of Western Australia's oldest towns. We will visit Five Rivers Lookout at the Bastions, followed by a tour of the old town. Later in the day we visit Parry's Lagoon, an oasis for birdlife and crocodiles, and The Grotto, soaking up the natural beauty of the Kimberley wilderness and what is a small, natural amphitheatre! (B,D)

Day 3

You have the opportunity for an early morning flight over the Bungle Bungle Range and Lake Argyle (own expense). After breakfast we enjoy a lovely cruise up the Ord River to Lake Argyle, spotting crocodiles and birdlife along the way. At the dam wall you are met by our driver and taken to the lookout for stunning views of the lake and river. Overnight at Lake Argyle Resort. (B,D)



Day 4

Sightseeing from the air this morning by helicopter for views over the Lake Argyle area and the Carr Boyd Ranges. We also visit the iconic Durack Homestead, and enjoy a cruise on the lake. (B)

Day 5

We head to Warmun, formerly known as Turkey Creek, for morning tea, then continue on to the town of Halls Creek, our stop for the night. (B,D)

Day 6

We start with a trip to historic Old Halls Creek, the site of the first gold discovery in WA, then visit the white quartz "China Wall". Later we enjoy a stop at Mary River for afternoon tea before continuing to Fitzroy Crossing, our stop for the night. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we travel to Tunnel Creek, made famous by the Aboriginal warrior Jandamarra. Tunnel Creek features a 750-metre tunnel which has worn through the Napier Range. We also visit the 3.5 km Windjana Gorge (spot the freshwater crocodiles)! (B,L,D)



Visit Mt Augustus, the largest rock on the planet, and Walga Rock, a huge monolith where you can see the largest gallery of Aboriginal rock paintings in WA.

Day 1

We travel from Perth to Cue today, through the Swan Valley, Bindoon, and Dalwallinu, spotting everlastings on the way. (D)





Day 2

Today we make our way through Meekatharra, the Murchison River (where we collect firewood for our campfire at Mt Augustus), and the heritage site of Mt Gould - one of WA's oldest police stations. We also visit the Landor Racetrack where races have been held since 1929. Our final stop is Mt Augustus resort and station, home for two nights. (B D) Upgrade available \$100 per night. (Shared amenities.)

Day 3

Mt Augustus and the lovely Lyons River are our focus today. Cattle Pool is situated at Lyons River, and here you'll have morning tea. We also explore Aboriginal art, rock formations, and enjoy the tranquility of the bush. Later we return to our accommodation for lunch and relaxation, and then it's back to Mt Augustus again to watch the sun go down whilst enjoying champagne and nibbles. We return to camp for our evening meal around the campfire. (B L D)

Day 4

Today we visit Big Bell, then Walga Rock, the second largest monolith in Australia. After a bush BBQ at Walga Rock we travel to Cue for the night. (B,L,D)




Today we visit Coolgardie, now known as a tourist town and a mining 'ghost town'. It was once the 3rd largest town in WA. Later we visit the RFDS centre, then enjoy time at the Hannans North Tourist Mine for a look back in time. (B,D)

Day 5

We continue our journey to the prosperous mining town of Norseman, via Kambalda and Lake Lefroy stopping for morning tea and lunch. We then take the back road to Hyden, our evening stop (B,D)

Day 6

This morning we visit Mulka's Cave to view Aboriginal paintings and learn about the legend of the area. We also visit the natural rock formation of Wave Rock and Hippo's Yawn, before heading back to Perth via Kondinin, Corrigin, and Brookton, arriving in Perth late in the afternoon. (B)







Kalbarri – Monkey Mia – Wildflowers

Sun 23 Aug to Sat 29 Aug 2020 (7 days)

A combination of stunning WA beaches, rugged gorges, unique floral landscapes, and the everpopular dolphins at Monkey Mia.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we travel through Bindoon and farmlands to the monastic town of New Norcia for morning tea. We continue to Moora for lunch, then drive via Three Springs and Mingenew, where the flowers should be in full bloom, to the seaside town of Geraldton for the night. (D)

Day 2

Today we visit the HMAS *Sydney* Memorial then continue via Northampton to Kalbarri, visiting the Lynton Convict Settlement ruins along the way, and later we visit the Rainbow Jungle Australian Parrot Breeding Centre, and Red Bluff Lookout—known for its wildflowers and kangaroos. Overnight in Kalbarri. (B,D)

Day 3

We start the day with a cruise on the Murchison River, enjoying morning tea and spotting local birdlife and wildlife. After lunch we visit the dramatic scenery and flora in Kalbarri National Park. The major geographical feature of the park includes the Murchison River Gorge which runs for nearly 80 km on the lower reaches of the Murchison River. (B,D)

Day 4

We continue our journey to Denham, stopping at Hawkes Head and Billabong Roadhouse. In the afternoon we visit the Hamelin Telegraph Station to see the Stromatolites and Shell Beach, before arriving at Denham for a two-night stopover. (B,D)

Day 5

Today we meet the dolphins of Monkey Mia. We'll watch a selection of dolphins being fed in the morning, and later we take a cruise on Shark Bay aboard the Catamaran Aristocat. After lunch we visit Eagles Nest boardwalk - a great place to spot sharks, dugongs and stingrays, and then there's free time to explore the town of Denham before dinner. (B)

Day 6

Departing Denham, we drive to the Overlander Roadhouse for morning tea, then continue on the West Coast Hwy to Chapman Valley and surrounding areas, searching for wildflowers. Overnight in Geraldton. (B,D)

Day 7

We head back to Perth through Dongara/Port Denison, and Jurien Bay, visiting the dramatic Pinnacles after lunch. We continue via Indian Ocean Drive, enjoying glimpses of the rugged coastline on the way, arriving back in Perth late afternoon. (B)

We are now on the Great Central Road, which runs 1,126 km from Laverton to Yulara in the Northern Territory. Spot wildlife along the way – dingoes, emus, kangaroos, camels, eagles and more... Overnight in Warburton. (B,D)

Day 4

Into the Gibson Desert where we visit the remote Giles weather station, Warakurna roadhouse, Schwerin Mural Crescent, and Docker River. We visit the legendary Lasseter's Cave, and catch glimpses of the Olgas (Kata Tjuta) in the distance. Overnight in Yulara. (B,D)

Day 5

We drive to Ayers Rock and the Olgas, and experience the sheer beauty and spiritual presence of these natural formations. Later we visit the Cultural Centre, and then Yulara Village. There is also an opportunity to fly over both Ayers Rock and the Olgas (own expense). By late afternoon we'll be back at the Rock for a barbecue dinner and sunset view! (B,D)



Day 6

We travel to Mullewa this morning, visiting the hillside lookout flowers, overlooking the town. In town we have morning tea and visit one of the many churches built by Dean Hawes. We continue across to Pindar to see the beautiful Wreath Leschenaultia which can only be seen in certain areas. We continue our wildflower journey with an afternoon visit to Coalseam Conservation Park, where pink, yellow and white everlastings cover the ground. (B,D)

This morning we travel through Port Denison for a morning tea stop, then to Indian Ocean Drive, where we visit Mt Lesueur National Park for another walk in the wildflowers. Heading further south, we stop for lunch at the lovely seaside town of Jurien Bay. Our last flower walk is at Nilgen Reserve before our return to Perth at around 5.00 pm after a wonderful wildflower experience. (B)

Day 5

We pack our gear and head towards a secret location for a morning painting session. Terry will show you how he paints the area around him and then it will be your turn to have a go. Later we make our way to Hawker, which will be our home for three nights. You will have time in the afternoon to visit the very interesting Jeff Morgan Gallery, famous for panoramic murals of the area. (B)

Day 6

A full day of painting at Rawnsley Park Station. Here we see some stunning vistas of Wilpena Pound and the surrounding Flinders Ranges. At lunch time you will have the opportunity to purchase a delicious outback lunch at the Woolshed Station Restaurant whilst appreciating the views around you. After lunch you will continue painting under Terry's guidance before we head back to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 7

We start the day with an opportunity to take a scenic flight over Wilpena Pound and the Flinders Ranges (own expense). Later this morning we visit the very famous Cazneaux Tree for a morning painting session, followed by a short drive into Wilpena Pound for you to buy lunch. We finish the day with a painting session at Wilpena Homestead before returning to Hawker. (B)

Day 8

This morning we leave Hawker and make our way to Orroroo for morning tea, then its on to the historic copper mining town of Burra for lunch, check-in and an afternoon painting session. We travel through classic outback territory to Mt Augustus – the world's largest single rock (bigger than Uluru) - and Karijini National Park with its spectacular gorges, creeks and chasms. On our return we follow the coast through the beautiful towns of Coral Bay, Carnarvon and Kalbarri. As it's wildflower time, we will no doubt be spoiled with spectacular colours wherever we look.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we start our adventure travelling through the Swan Valley, Bindoon and Dalwallinu, spotting wildflowers along the way. Later we reach the tiny settlement of Paynes Find, popular for carpets of everlastings, and continue on to Mount Magnet and the outback town of Cue, our overnight stop. (D)

Day 2

This morning we drive to Meekatharra and have a tour of the town before hitting the dirt road to Mt Augustus. We stop at the Murchison River, a delightful area for bird life, flora and fauna; then Mt Gould, site of one of WA's oldest police stations; and the historical Landor Race Track. We continue to our accommodation at Mt Augustus Resort and Station, our home for two nights. (B,D) (Shared amenities – ensuited upgrade available @\$100/nt extra per room).

Day 3

This morning is all about Mt Augustus, the lovely Lyons River, and Cattle Pool - an absolutely wonderful spot with its amazing large river gums, birdlife and animals. Around the rock we stop at various locations to explore Aboriginal art, wonderful rock formations and experience the scent of the bush. Later we return to our accommodation for lunch. The afternoon is yours to explore until later when we travel to our sunset viewing area to watch the sun go down on the largest rock in the world, while we enjoy champagne and nibbles. Later it's back to camp for our evening meal around the campfire. What a truly wonderful day! (B,L,D)



Day 4

We say goodbye to Mt Augustus and travel along Mt Augustus Woodlands Road, passing some wonderful scenery and abandoned stations, before arriving at Tom Price, our home for two nights. (B,L,D)

Day 5

Today is all about Karijini National Park in the majestic Hamersley Ranges. Karijini National Park is an iconic, unspoiled nature-based destination offering a unique landscape and an unforgettable WA outback experience. It is famous for its dramatic creeks, spectacular gorges and towering sheer sided chasms up to 100 metres deep. We spend most of the day here with the opportunity to swim before heading back to Tom Price for the night. (B,L)

Day 6

We travel the Nanutarra – Munjina road to Nanutarra roadhouse with time to sight the Ashburton River on the way. On the North West Coastal Highway then, heading towards Coral Bay. The scenery changes and we will spot large termite mounds and coastal vegetation. Overnight in the popular coastal town of Coral Bay. (B,D)



Day 7

This morning we enjoy a fascinating cruise of the Ningaloo Reef in a glass bottom boat, then after lunch we head to Carnarvon, where we take in some of the town attractions before arriving at our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 8

This morning we visit the Carnarvon Space and Technology museum, guite an eye opener even if you're not interested in outer space, and then we continue on to Kalbarri via the Murchison River. (B D)

Day 9

The gorges and formations carved by the Murchison River attract thousands of visitors to Kalbarri National Park and we are no exception. We visit Nature's Window as well as Hawks Head Lookout in the morning. In the afternoon we visit Bluff Point to view the spectacular coastline and coastal wildflowers, then late enjoy a sunset cruise on the Murchison. (B,D)

Day 10

Departing Kalbarri, we travel to Geraldton to visit the HMAS Sydney memorial before lunch. We take the Indian Ocean Drive home via Dongara returning to Perth later in the afternoon. (B)

Day 1

You will be met mid-morning at Adelaide airport by your Aussie Redback Tours team, tutor, and fellow artists. We drive to our accommodation at Kingscote where we enjoy dinner and settle in for the night. (D)

Later we pack up and take a short drive across to Cape Du Coedic Lighthouse, and boardwalk to Admiral's Arch. In the afternoon we continue to Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park in time for koala viewing and a koala holding experience (own expense). We have dinner together tonight at our hotel.(B,D)





Day 4

We have a more leisurely pace today. After breakfast we pack our gear and travel to our next stop— American River, named after American sealers who camped in the area in the 1800s. It's a beautiful spot for painting and you will have a wonderful choice of boats, pelicans, swans, reflections, rocks, and much more to capture in your sketches. We sketch in the morning under Renata's guidance, stop for lunch and check-in at our hotel. The afternoon is free for more sketching and relaxing before dinner together tonight at the hotel. (B,D)

Day 5

This morning you have the opportunity to enjoy a typical American River sunrise. Spend time sketching and photographing before a late breakfast, then around mid-morning we drive to the ferry port of Penneshaw. Penneshaw also features a Maritime and Folk museum, Frenchman's Rock, quaint little seaside cottages, and night tours to a colony of little penguins, the only species to breed in Australian waters. We'll have lunch in Penneshaw, then spend the afternoon exploring and sketching this little town. Tonight is a "dinner-free" night where you can purchase your own meal, then later those who wish can take part in the evening Penguin tour (own expense). Besides penguins, you will also have the chance to spot wallabies, possums and other seabirds. Later we travel back to our accommodation in American River. (B)

We round up our day with the Birds of Prey Show at Raptor Domain. Listen to the successful bird rehabilitation stories of Dave and Leeza Erwin during the freeflight bird presentation. It is time to make our way to our accommodation for a delicious dinner and a peaceful night. (B,D)





Day 3

Today we show you the wonders of Flinders Chase National Park. One of the most iconic features are the Remarkable Rocks, a cluster of granite boulders with golden orange lichen. Walk around them, through them and take plenty of photographs before we head to Admirals Arch which was formed by massive natural forces. From the platform here you can observe a colony of New Zealand fur seals. Kangaroo Island is also well-known for glorious birds, kangaroos, possums, echidnas, and koalas, and you should be able to spot these during our time here. We continue our incredible day to see the underground Kelly Hill Caves. Beneath the vast expanse of native bushland, we discover treasures of impressive stalagmites, stalactites, helictites and straws. Back at our accommodation there is time for a short walk at your own leisure or relax with "Happy Hour" drinks before dinner. (B,D)

Today is all about Mt Augustus, Lyons River and Cattle Pool, where we have morning tea, a swim, and a look at Aboriginal art and rock formations. Free time to relax in the afternoon then later we enjoy champagne and nibbles whilst we watch the sun go down on the largest rock in the world. We finish the day with our evening meal around the campfire. (B L D)

Day 4

We say goodbye to Mt Augustus and make our way to the ruins of Big Bell, then Walga Rock, the second largest monolith in Australia (5 km around the base and 1.5 km long). We have a bush BBQ here then head to Cue for the night. (B,L,D)

Day 5

On to Yalgoo for morning tea and a visit to Jokers Tunnel, which was carved though solid rock by early gold prospectors. We arrive at Wubin for lunch before continuing our journey, arriving back in Perth in the late afternoon. (B)



The "Made on Bruny Island" gourmet trail is another very special reason why we have visited the Island. (B)

Day 4

Today we leave the Island and visit the Tahune Airwalk, sharing the lives of the forest giants from up-close, looking down to the place where the wild waters of the Huon and Picton Rivers mingle. Later we continue to Southport, known as Australia's southernmost settlement. Here we spend a lazy two night stop over. (B,D)

Day 5

Departing Ida Bay Station, we travel through the most pristine southern-most Tasmanian bush, where peaceful Lake Lune River meets the ocean, and you will travel on one of the most iconic railways in history. The two-hour journey from the Ida Bay Station to the Elliott's Beach next to the Recherche Bay is a must. Free time later in Southport. (B,D) Train ride included on fare.

Day 6

We travel through Dover, Oatlands and Campbell Town, before arriving in Launceston, with stops on the way to explore. (B,D)

Day 7

This morning in the heart of Launceston, we visit the beautiful City Park, featuring magnificent mature shrubs and trees, many of English origin, before an afternoon on the water to explore the magical Tamar River and Cataract Gorge on-board the Tamar Odyssey. (B)

Day 8

Stanley is a town of perfectly preserved colonial buildings, all sheltering in the imposing shadow of the Nut, an immense flat topped, volcanic plug rising 150m straight up from the water's edge. In the afternoon we visit the Stanley Museum, then there's free time to explore. (B,D)

Day 10

We travel to Arthur River this morning and enjoy a cruise on the *MV George Robinson* – a beautiful old steel-hulled vessel fitted out with Tasmanian timber and brass. Magical reflections of the lush vegetation in the tannin coloured river, and pristine densely forested river banks of myrtles, blackwoods, leatherwoods, sassafras, silver wattles and endangered Brooker's gums will keep you spellbound. At Turk's Landing, you will be captivated by the giant brown top stringybark (Tassie Oak) and the ancient giant tree ferns. On board we enjoy morning tea and a BBQ lunch, before returning to Stanley. (B,L)

Day 11

Departing Stanley we return to Hobart, stopping on the way at Deloraine and Historic old Ross, a tranquil village offering an amazing opportunity for visitors to experience the beauty and drama of Tasmania's colonial history. Later we arrive in Hobart for our last night together. (B,D)
