WA's Southern Getaway

Sun 12 March to Tue 14 March 2022 (3 days)

A three-day leisurely tour of WA's beautiful south-west.

Day 1

Departing East Perth at 7.30 am, we head south. We visit the Ha Ve Cheese factory, take a tram ride on the Busselton Jetty, and make our way to the Abbey Beach Resort, our home for the next 2 nights. (D)

Day 2

Today we visit Margaret River, the Boranup Karri Forest, and the Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse at Augusta where two oceans meet. Free time in Margaret River later in the afternoon. (B,D)

Day 3

Today we return to Perth, stopping at Mandurah on the way for a scenic boat cruise of the canals and the dolphins. (B,L)

Albany, Walpole and the Great Southern

Sun 26 March to Wed 29 March 2022 (4 Days)

A wonderful leisurely tour through the south of the state

Day 1

Departing Perth and onto York where we enjoy morning tea, then onto Albany, passing through Narrogin, Wagin and Katanning before reaching Albany for three nights. We settle into our accommodation and enjoy an evening meal and a get to know you drink. (D)

Day 2

A wonderful drive through the forest to Walpole before an entertaining cruise on the Walpole and Nornalup Inlets discussing the history of the estuary. After Lunch in this quaint little town site, we continue to the Valley of the Giants. Return to Albany via Denmark. Note: (Boat Cruise and Tree Top Walk included (B, D)

Day 3

This morning we visit the Torndirrup National Park to view the recently redeveloped Gap & Natural Bridge, a must see. In the afternoon its onto Albany's Historic Whaling Station. Cheynes Beach Whaling Company was the last whaling company in Australia to be operating but closed in 1978. An interesting insite into our whaling past. (Tondirrup and Whaling Station Entry Included. (B, D)



Day 4

Today we visit Mount Clarence for a tour of the National ANZAC Centre at Princess Royal Fort overlooking King George Sound. We return to Albany for lunch, before returning to Perth via Mount Barker, Kojonup and Williams. (B)

Nullarbor, Port Lincoln, Flinders Ranges

Sat 02 April to Mon 11 April 2022 (10 days)

Join us on this magical tour across the Nullarbor Plain, visiting some of the wonderful coastal towns of South Australia along the Great Australian Bight. We visit iconic outback and coastal towns before finishing in the rugged beauty of the Flinders Ranges.

Day 1

We depart Perth and head south on the Albany Highway, then on to Hyden, Wave Rock, and Mulka's Cave, which has a very interesting Aboriginal legend associated with it. Overnight in Hyden. (D)

Day 2

This morning we leave Hyden and make our way towards Norseman on the Norseman Hyden road, stopping at the beautiful Lake Johnson on the way. We have some time in Norseman before taking the Eyre Highway across the Nullarbor. We pass Dundas Nature reserve on the way to Balladonia, which is our evening stop. (B)

Day 3

Continuing on our journey, we travel the longest straight road in the world, the "90 Mile Straight", stopping to enjoy the spectacular vista of the Great Australian Bight on the way. Later we cross the WA border into South Australia at Eucla. With the great Southern Ocean on our right, we arrive at the Nullarbor Motel, our evening stop. (B,D)

Day 4

Today we finish our road trip across the Nullarbor and make our way to the coastal town of Ceduna, on the shores of Murat Bay. Ceduna has played an important role in Australia's overall development due to it being a fishing port and a railway hub. We spend some time here, before taking the Flinders Hwy to Streaky Bay, another lovely coastal town, and our evening stop. (B,D)

Day 5

Today on our way to Port Lincoln we visit Murphy's Haystacks, which are ancient, wind-worn pillars and boulders of pink granite estimated to be over 1,500 million years old. Set in the middle of a wheat field and surrounded by mallee scrub, they are one of the most popular and photographed attractions on the Eyre Peninsula. Later it's on to Elliston, located on Waterloo Bay, then to Coffin Bay and Port Lincoln, our home for the next two nights. (B,D)



Day 6

Welcome to Port Lincoln, the "the seafood capital of Australia". With its population of 14,000, Port Lincoln is a major commercial centre for the Eyre Peninsula and a popular destination for visitors. In the Afternoon we'll discover Australia's largest commercial fishing fleet and our millionaire's playground. Learn the history and future of the Lincoln Cove Marina on a cruise, as well as a brief overview of Port Lincoln's various fishing industries. Later we return to our accommodation. (B)

Dav 7

We travel beside the Spencer's Gulf today, and visit Tumby Bay, Arno Bay, Whyalla and Port Augusta, before Travelling on to Hawker "The Gateway to the Flinders Ranges", and our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 8

This morning we visit the wonderful little town of Blinman. Historic Blinman is the highest town in South Australia, set deep in the heart of the Flinders Ranges. In the afternoon we visit the interesting old Wilpena Station, an amazingly kept piece of Australian History. We also visit Wilpena Pound before returning to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 9

Departing Hawker we make our way to the Flinders Ranges town of Orroroo for a morning tea stop, then on to the historic town of Burra. We discover the past of this heritage listed town, before arriving in Adelaide for our last night together. (B,D)

Day 10

This morning we visit the Adelaide Botanical Gardens and the seaside town of Glenelg, before you are transferred to the airport for your flight home. (B)

Mt Augustus and Walga Rock

Sat 16 April to Wed 20 April 2022 (5 days)

Seniors \$1460 Adults \$1610 S/Supp \$320 pp (Upgrade available at Mt Augustus \$100 p/n)

Mount Augustus, for all its isolation, is one of the true wonders of Australia and the largest rock on the planet. The local Wajarri Aboriginal people called the mountain "Burringurrah". Walga Rock is a huge monolith, where you can see the largest gallery of Aboriginal rock paintings in Western Australia. Contact us for a full itinerary with all the inclusions.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we start our adventure travelling through the Swan Valley on the Great Northern Highway and arriving at Bindoon for a morning tea stop. We later continue through wheat and sheep country to Dalwallinu, where we stop for lunch. We continue to the tiny settlement of Paynes Find and on the sides of the road at this time of the year we should experience carpets of everlastings, a visual delight. We have a comfort stop and then head on to Mount Magnet and to the outback town of Cue, our overnight stop. (D)

Day 2

This morning we take a short drive to Meekatharra for a tour of the town before hitting the dirt road to Mt Augustus. Our first stop on the way is at the Murchison River, a delightful area for bird life and flora and fauna. We collect some firewood here for our campfire for the next two nights at Mt Augustus. Our next stop on the way is the heritage site of Mt Gould. This is the site of one of Western Australia's oldest police stations, built in 1880 and one which has a very interesting story. We next arrive at the Landor Racetrack. Races have been held here since 1929 and continue to run every year in October. We have a look around before heading to our destination. On the way we will experience the wonder of Mt Augustus from a distance, an amazing sight. Later we arrive at our accommodation for a two-night stop over at Mt Augustus resort and station. (BD)

This morning is all about the rock—Mt Augustus and the lovely Lyons River, which is where Cattle Pool is situated. This is a wonderful spot, with its amazing large river gums, birdlife and animals. We enjoy a morning tea here and for those who are game, a swim is on offer! Around the rock we stop at various locations to explore Aboriginal art, wonderful rock formations and experience the scent of the bush - it doesn't get much better. Later we return to our accommodation for lunch and then the afternoon is vours to explore, relax and take in this vast area. In the late afternoon we travel to our sunset viewing area and watch the sun go down on the largest rock in the world - guite a sight to experience - while we enjoy champagne and nibbles. Later back to camp for our evening meal around the campfire. What a truly wonderful day! (B L D)

Day 4

We say goodbye to Mt Augustus today and head out, turning south and crossing the Murchison River. We continue to the ruins of Big Bell and then Walga Rock, a monolith which is 5 km around the base and 1.5 km long, the second largest in Australia. We explore the area and then continue to Cue in the late afternoon. (B L D)

Day 5

Today we visit Yalgoo for morning tea and a visit to Jokers Tunnel. This tunnel was carved though solid rock by early gold prospectors. We arrive at Wubin for lunch before continuing our journey, having an afternoon stop before arriving back in Perth, after a wonderful tour of the Murchison area. (B)



Adelaide to the Red Centre

Sun 24 Apr to Tue 03 May 2022 (10 days)

Day 1


We begin in Adelaide, home of Festivals, food, arts and culture. We visit the Mt Lofty Summit, the majestic peak of the Mount Lofty Ranges in the Adelaide Hills, which provides spectacular panoramic views across Adelaide's city skyline to the coast. Later you can enjoy a ride on "Popeye" on the Torrens River (own expense) for a different look at the city, or immerse yourself in the culture of Adelaide's North Terrace, before being transferred to your accommodation. (D)

Day 2

We begin our day by travelling to Port Pirie. Smelters have been in operation here since 1889, and it became the biggest lead smelter in the world by 1934. In the afternoon we advance to Port Augusta, on the Spencers Gulf. Here we visit the Wadlata Centre for an intriguing journey back in time before continuing on to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 3

We start the day by visiting Mathew Flinders Lookout in the Arid Botanical Gardens, looking out over the Flinders Ranges. We continue on to Lake Gairdner, the largest salt lake in South Australia. We follow the highway to Woomera, famous for its RAAF Woomera Range Complex (a large systems testing range covering an area of approximately 122,000 sq kms). The Woomera Project lasted for 34 years and became one of the most secret allied establishments in operation during the Cold War. In the afternoon we reach Coober Pedy - our home for two nights. (B,D)





Day 4

Today we spend the day in Coober Pedy, one of Australia's most multi-cultural towns. Coober Pedy mines over 92% of Australian opals and you have a chance to buy your very own opal today during our town tour. In the late afternoon we travel to the breakaways for pre-dinner drinks and nibbles whilst watching a magical sunset. (B)

Day 5

We travel to Marla, Mt Connor and Lake Amadeus along the way to the 1-million acre cattle property at Curtin Springs, our accommodation for the next two nights. (B,D)

Day 6

Today is all about the "Rock" and the "Olgas". We enjoy a very informative tour with a local guide, and have the opportunity to visit the Cultural Centre . You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to the "Rock" for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset in the evening. (B,D)

Day 7

Leaving Yulara today, we continue our journey to Kings Canyon in the Watarrka National Park. We walk into the Gorge, marvelling at its breathtaking 100m high walls, later continuing on to our accommodation. From here we experience a wonderful sunset over the Watarrka National Park. Note: Helicopter flight opportunity over Watarrka National Park (own expense). (B,L,D)

Day 8

On to Alice Springs where we visit the historic Telegraph Station and Anzac Hill Lookout before a visit to the stunning Simpson's Gap, returning via Honeymoon Gap. We settle into our accommodation then enjoy drinks and nibbles before dinner at the nearby Range View Restaurant. (B)

Day 9

We visit the amazing Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. We continue to Ross River Homestead for lunch. The homestead is the historic Loves Creek Homestead built in 1898 by the pioneering Bloomfield family as a working cattle station. We return to Alice in the afternoon. (B,D)

Day 10

Today we say our farewells. You will be transported to the airport for your flight home, taking some wonderful Red Centre memories with you. (B)

Day 1

Departing Perth we travel through the wheatbelt towns of Dalwallinu and Wubin and arrive in the historic outback town of Cue, our stop for the night. (D)

Day 2

We continue the Great Northern Hwy to Meekathara, passing pastoral leases of the Gascoyne area, arriving in the afternoon to the mining town of Newman. (B, D)

Day 3

Today onto Karijini National Park, we spend time in the very impressive range country and visit Dales Gorge, Circular Pool and Fortescue Falls. Then onto Tom Price, our home for the night. (B, L, D)

Day 4

Departing Tom Price we travel via Paraburdoo to Nanutarra on the Ashburton River. On to Cape Range National Park and the spectacular scenery of Charles Knife Road, where oil was first found in Western Australia in the 1950's. Overnight in Exmouth. (B)

Day 6

We visit the Babbage Island Jetty and the Fishing Harbour. This is the old Northwest, sheep station country, where so many over the last 130 years have battled drought and great floods. Further south on the road to Shark Bay we come to Hamelin Pool and Shell Beach to see the ancient Stromatolites. We spend 2 nights in Denham. (B, D)

Day 7


A morning visit to Monkey Mia to see those magnificent creatures of the wild, dolphins, we also enjoy a boat cruise on the Bay. Later "Ocean Park", an exciting eco-friendly and interactive aquarium that is located on the pristine shores of the Shark Bay World Heritage Marine Park, we learn about many fascinating marine creatures that are found in this heritage listed area. (Boat cruise, Ocean Park included in your fare. (B)

Day 8

Back to the Northwest Coastal Highway through Northampton to Geraldton. On the shores of Champion Bay this town has undergone some magnificent redevelopment in the last few years and has been given a new lease of life. We tour the town and visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial. (B, D)

Dav 9

We return to Perth today, but first we call into the historic village of Greenough for a look around this well-kept piece of history. Later we pass through the seaside town of Dongara and enjoy a lunch stop at Jurien Bay, before arriving back in Perth. (B)



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Alice to the Top End

Fri 06 May to Tue 16 May 2022 (11 days)

On this amazing Northern Territory tour you can journey through the outback and discover the incredible natural wonders. The Australian outback has to be experienced to be believed. On this tour we visit many of the NT's most popular attractions.

Day 1

Arrive in Alice Springs where you are met by the Aussie Redback Tours team and transferred to town. You will have time to visit some of the local attractions before checking into our accommodation and a meet and greet with fellow travellers. Tonight we dine at the Alice Springs Golf Club. (D)

Day 2

Today we visit the amazing Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. We continue to Ross River Homestead for lunch. The appeal of Ross River lies in the remarkable N'Dhala Gorge Nature Park which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. Overnight in Alice Springs. (B,D)

Day 3

We visit Simpsons Gap in the MacDonnell Ranges, then later the stunning Ormiston Gorge. Within the gorge is a permanent waterhole which attracts all kinds of birdlife and animals. We return to Alice in the late afternoon. (B,D)

Day 4

Today we travel north towards Aileron, Barrow Creek, stopping at the interesting and precariously balanced Karlu-Karlu (Devils Marbles). Overnight in the old gold mining town of Tennant Creek. (B,D)

Day 5

Still travelling north we visit the eccentric Daly Waters Historic Pub for a refreshing beer at lunchtime, then continue to Mataranka, 'Land of the Never Never'. At Mataranka you can visit the replica of the original Elsey Homestead, used in the filming of 'We of the Never Never'. You may also like to take a dip in the famous thermal springs. Overnight in Katherine. (B,D)

Day 6

We start with an early morning cruise through Katherine Gorge in Nitmiluk National Park where you'll learn the cultural significance of the first two gorges to the traditional landowners, the Jawoyn people. Keep an eye out for the resident crocodiles! We continue to Kakadu National Park for a cruise on the famous Yellow Water Billabong. You should see a stunning variety of birdlife such as sea eagles, brolgas and with any luck, fascinating little kingfishers. You'll also see feared estuarine crocodiles basking in the muddy shallows. We spend the night in this amazing area. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we visit Ubirr in the Kakadu National Park. We view Aboriginal rock art dating back some 20,000 years. You can climb to the top of this rocky outcrop for spectacular views over the floodplains and escarpment country, a location you may recognise from the famous Australian film, Crocodile Dundee. On the road again, we make our way to Adelaide River. (B)

Day 8

This morning we visit the Adelaide River Cemetery before we travel to Litchfield National Park, a must see if you're in the Top End. It's home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into crystal clear pools. We stop at the amazing Termite Mounds before arriving at tropical Wangi Falls for a relaxing swim in the large crystal clear pool before arriving at Darwin. (B,D)

Day 9

This morning for a full tour of Battery Point, The Port and the City Centre. We also visit the Darwin Museum; depicting the events of cyclone Tracey in 1974 and the East Point Military Museum; depicting the bombing raids on Darwin in 1942. Free time in the city for shopping and dinner. (B)

Day 10

Today we head to Adelaide River, home of the Jumping Crocs, where we enjoy a cruise on the river and witness some of Australia's most feared animals do their stuff. We also visit Humpty Doo Rice Fields and Fogg Dam. (B,D)

Day 11

Your holiday concludes this morning after breakfast. You will be transferred to Darwin Airport to connect with your onward flight home, after a wonderful tour of the Top End. (B)

Darwin To Broome

Sat 28 May to Wed 08 June 2022 (12 days)

From Darwin in the top end to Broome in the west, join us on this scenic tour through the Northern Territory to the Kimberley. Stunning scenery, majestic gorges, and vast rivers make this tour a "must-do".

Day 1

Fly into Darwin where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours crew. We take an afternoon tour of the city before check-in at our accommodation and enjoying our first dinner together. (D)

Day 2

Today we explore Darwin. We visit the Darwin Military Museum, stroll through the Darwin Botanic Gardens, and enjoy free time in the city before an afternoon sunset dinner cruise on Darwin Harbour. (B,D)

Day 3

Travelling south on the Stuart Hwy today, we stop at Adelaide River's poignant War Cemetery. This afternoon we continue via Katherine to Nitmiluk National Park, where a tranquil cruise along the spectacular Katherine Gorge will allow you to sense the spirituality of the land. Catch glimpses of wildlife and learn about the history and culture of the local traditional owners, the Jawoyn people. Overnight in Katherine. (B,D)

Day 4

Watch the landscape transform dramatically today as we journey across vast pastoral leases and Aboriginal homelands, heading towards WA before enjoying a sunset cruise on the stunning Victoria River. Overnight in Timber Creek. (B,D)

Day 5

We travel to Lake Argyle today and visit the historic Durack Homestead, built in 1895. This afternoon and evening is free time to relax, purchase your own dinner and enjoy this amazing area of the Kimberley. Optional helicopter flight over Lake Argyle and the Ord River dam (own expense). (B)

Day 6

This morning we explore the rugged northern end of Lake Argyle, with an informative commentary on a morning cruise of the lake. In the afternoon we cruise the Ord River to Kununurra, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 7

Today you may choose an optional early-morning scenic flight over the spectacular Bungle Bungles before a short drive to Wyndham and the Five Rivers Lookout. 
