Day 1

We depart Perth and head south on the Albany Highway, then on to Hyden, Wave Rock, and Mulka's Cave, which has an interesting Aboriginal legend associated with it. Overnight in Hyden. (D)

Day 2

This morning we leave Hyden and make our way towards Norseman on the Norseman Hyden road, stopping at the beautiful Lake Johnson on the way. We have some time in Norseman before taking the Eyre Highway across the Nullarbor. We pass Dundas Nature reserve on the way to Balladonia, which is our evening stop. (B)

Day 3

Continuing on our journey, we travel the longest straight road in the world, the "90 Mile Straight", stopping to enjoy the spectacular vista of the Great Australian Bight on the way. Later we cross the WA border into South Australia at Eucla. With the great Southern Ocean on our right, we arrive at the Nullarbor Motel, our evening stop. (B,D)

Day 4

Today we finish our road trip across the Nullarbor and make our way to the coastal town of Ceduna, on the shores of Murat Bay. Ceduna has played an important role in Australia's overall development due to it being a fishing port and a railway hub. We spend some time here, before taking the Flinders Hwy to Streaky Bay, another lovely coastal town, and our evening stop. (B,D)

Day 5

Today on our way to Port Lincoln we visit Murphy's Haystacks, which are ancient, wind-worn pillars and boulders of pink granite estimated to be over 1,500 million years old. Set in the middle of a wheat field and surrounded by mallee scrub, they are one of the most popular and photographed attractions on the



Eyre Peninsula. Later it's on to Elliston, located on Waterloo Bay, then to Coffin Bay and Port Lincoln, our home for the next two nights. (B,D)

Day 6

Welcome to Port Lincoln, the "Seafood Capital of Australia". With its population of 14,000, Port Lincoln is a major commercial centre for the Eyre Peninsula and a popular destination for visitors. In the Afternoon we'll discover Australia's largest commercial fishing fleet and our millionaire's playground. Learn the history and future of the Lincoln Cove Marina on a cruise, as well as a brief overview of Port Lincoln's various fishing industries. Later we return to our accommodation. (B)

Day 7

We travel beside the Spencer's Gulf today, and visit Tumby Bay, Arno Bay, Whyalla and Port Augusta, before Travelling on to Hawker "The Gateway to the Flinders Ranges", and our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 8

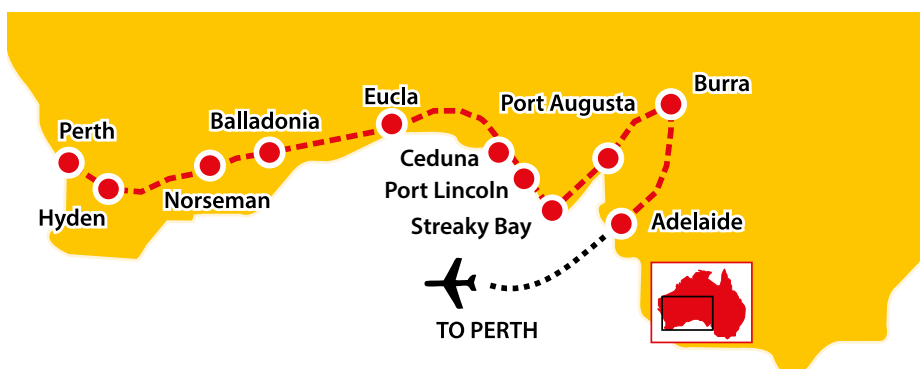
This morning we visit the wonderful little town of Blinman. Historic Blinman is the highest town in South Australia, set deep in the heart of the Flinders Ranges. In the afternoon we visit the interesting old Wilpena Station, an amazingly kept piece of Australian History. We also visit Wilpena Pound (6.6kms return walk to old homestead) before returning to our accommodation. (B)

Day 9

Departing Hawker we make our way to the Flinders Ranges town of Ororoo for a morning tea stop, then on to the historic town of Burra. We discover the past of this heritage listed town, before arriving in Adelaide for our last night together. (B,D)

Day 10

This morning we will visit the Adelaide Botanical Gardens (time permitting), before a transfer to the airport for your flight home. (B)

Day 1

Departing Perth, you'll arrive in Hobart to be met by your crew and transferred to your accommodation. (D)

Day 2

Today we visit Battery Point, Salamanca Markets, the Botanical Gardens and Mt Wellington (renowned for its amazing views of Hobart). Later we have free time in Hobart to wander at leisure, before returning to our motel. (B)

Day 3

We travel to Port Arthur to learn all about this dreadful penal colony and most infamous prison. Later we visit Tasman's Arch, Hell's Kitchen and Doo Town. The actual channel is between Macquarie Heads on the west and Entrance Island on the east (the main length of the harbour runs south-east of Hells Gates). (B,D)

Day 4

This morning it's on to New Norfolk and the magnificent Mt Field National Park, location of the spectacular three-tiered Russell Falls. We also visit the Wall in the Wilderness sculpture which commemorates those who shaped the area's past and present. We also take a winding journey up to Lake St Clair and continue a scenic drive to Queenstown. (B,D)

Day 5

Across to Strahan today for a Gordon River Cruise, where the wilderness comes to the water's edge. The cruise includes lunch on board and stops at Sarah Island where you can explore the ruins of the penal colony. (B,L)

Day 6

We travel through Zeehan to the mining and hydroelectric towns of Rosebery and Tullah, then on to Cradle Mountain National Park. Once here you can meander through the forest and alpine heathlands on a purpose-built boardwalk. Later we take a short drive to Sheffield, home of over 60 murals, which will be our stop for the night. (B)

Day 7

Today we visit Devonport, the southern terminus for the Spirit of Tasmania ferries. We also visit the Beaconsfield Mine and Heritage Centre, known for the 2006 Beaconsfield mining tragedy. We continue to Launceston, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 8

Today we visit the historic town of George Town, it is Australia's 3rd oldest city behind only Hobart and Sydney. Later we visit Bridestowe Lavender Estate. We also stop at Lilydale to take in the stunning waterfalls, then continue to Cataract Gorge before continuing to Launceston. (B)

Day 9

On to Legerwood today for a look at the Legerwood Carved Memorial Trees, but first a stop at Scottsdale. Later we walk along the avenue of trees and view the WW1 history on display. Next is the old tin town of Derby and then St Helens on George Bay, our home for the next two nights. (B,D)

Day 10

Today we experience the exquisite beauty of Wineglass Bay on a 4.5-hour cruise of the Freycinet Peninsula. The cruise will take you from the gentle

shores of Coles Bay along the Freycinet coast to one of the world's best beaches. (B,L)

Day 11

We journey to the historic 19th century village of Ross which boasts the exquisite Ross Bridge with its 186 carvings of Celtic symbols. Later onto Oatlands and then historic Richmond. In the afternoon we make our way on the Midlands Hwy to Hobart for our last night in Tasmania. (B,D)

Day 12

This morning you are transported to the airport for your flight home, after a fascinating look at the "Apple Isle" (B)

We enjoy a morning visit to Bluff knoll, then on to Two People's Bay Nature Reserve - a very welcoming place with much to see and explore. The beaches of Little and Waterfall are so beautiful they're hard to describe. Later we return to Albany. (B,D)

Day 3

A morning visit to Denmark and then on to William Bay, home of the wonderful Greens Pool and Elephant Rocks. Later we travel to Walpole for lunch, then an afternoon visit to Fernhook Falls and the timber town of Manjimup. (B,D)

Day 4

On the way home today we enjoy a morning cruise on the beautiful Donnelly River, then we travel through the pretty town of Bridgetown on our way to Donnybrook for a lunch stop. We arrive back in Perth late afternoon. (B)

Day 1

Arrive in Adelaide where you are met by the Aussie Redback Tours team. We begin with a tour of this beautiful "City of Churches", visiting the famous Colonel Light Lookout which honours the pioneers of the city. We continue south to Victor Harbor, our overnight stay before our KI adventure begins. (D)

Day 2

This morning we board the Kangaroo Island ferry from Cape Jervis. Once on land we visit the Emu



Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery, followed by a visit to Seal Bay. Enjoy getting up close to the seals for amazing photographs before we round up our day with the Birds of Prey Show at Raptor Domain. Later we make our way to our accommodation for our evening meal. (B,D)

Day 3

Today we show you the wonders of Flinders Chase National Park. One of the most iconic features are the Remarkable Rocks, a cluster of granite boulders with golden orange lichen. We also head to Admirals Arch, which was formed by massive natural forces, and from the platform you can observe a colony of New Zealand fur seals. Back at our accommodation there is time for a short walk at your own leisure or relax with "Happy Hour" drinks before dinner. (B,D)

Day 4

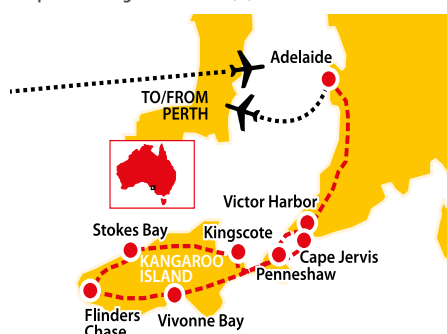
We start the day with the Birds of Prey Show at Raptor Domain. Later a drive to Vivonne Bay, a long sandy beach with a picturesque wooden jetty and beautiful turquoise water. The sand dunes of Little Sahara are our next stop, and for lunch we travel to Stokes Bay on the north coast. We round up the day with a visit to the Bay of Shoals winery for some wine tasting whilst enjoying the magnificent ocean scenery. (B)

Day 5

Today we take the ferry back to Cape Jervis and make our way to Victor Harbor, Strathalbyn, then continue to Adelaide for our last night together. (B,D)

Day 6

This morning, time permitting, we visit the beautiful Adelaide botanical gardens, before transfers to the airport for flights home. (B)

WA's Coral Coast – Perth to Broome

Sun 26 April to Thu 07 May 2026 (12 days)

Discover some of the world's most diverse marine habitats just metres away from pristine beaches on the coast of WA. MAGICAL!

Day 1

Taking the Indian Ocean Drive out of Perth, we sight the sparkling Indian Ocean on our west. We travel through many cray fishing towns to Jurien Bay for morning tea and then on to Green Head, Leeman, and then Dongara for lunch. We also visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial overlooking Geraldton before settling into our accommodation for the night. (D)

Day 2

On to the Kalbarri National Park where we visit Nature's Window and the Skywalk before returning to town. In the afternoon we visit the coastal gorges before returning to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 3

We return to the Northwest Coastal Highway where the country soon changes to open plains and sprawling sheep stations. Our journey continues to Carnarvon on the Gascoyne River, our stop for the night. (B,D)

Day 4

Today we continue north to Coral Bay for a glass bottom boat cruise to view the striking coral of Ningaloo Reef before free time to snorkel or swim on the reef. A two-night stopover at Exmouth, the centre for the Navy Nor-West Cape Base and the Harold E Holt Communications Base. (B)

Day 5

We travel to the head of the Gulf to take in the view from the Vlaming Lighthouse. Out on a glass bottom boat cruise to view the striking coral of Ningaloo Reef before continuing further down the Cape to Yardie Creek in the Cape Range National Park, a beautiful, rugged, iconic WA coastline. In the afternoon there's time to relax by the pool. (B,D)

Day 6

We head along the coast to Onslow. In the early settlement days, pearls were found in Exmouth Gulf and the town became home port to a fleet of pearling luggers. The town has been touched by cyclones over the years and even war in 1943, when a single Japanese plane reached here in World War II, bombing the airfield. Onslow has two lookouts located a short distance from one another, with both providing wonderful views of the ocean and the Mackerel Islands. (B,D)

Day 7

Karratha was established in 1968 to accommodate the processing and exportation workforce of the Hamersley Iron mining company and, in the 1980s,



the petroleum and liquefied natural gas operations of the Northwest Shelf Venture, We visit these enormous operations followed by a visit to the Red Dog memorial and the Burrup Rock Art site. Later we arrive at our accommodation for a two-night stopover in Dampier. (B,D)

Day 8

Today we head to the old pearling town of Cossack with its once thriving pearling industry. We visit the port before exploring Port Samson. Later we return to our accommodation. (B)

Day 9

A leisurely drive to Port Hedland today, stopping along the way for morning tea and lunch. Port Hedland is the second largest town in the Pilbara region of Western Australia. We visit the Old Port Hedland town and the Port to see the large-scale mining operations of the area. (B,D)

Day 10

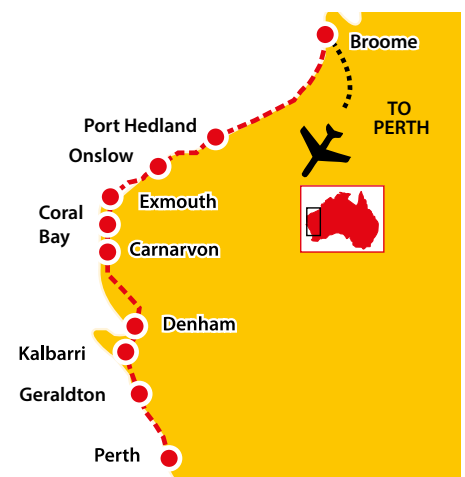
Today we travel through spectacular landscapes en route to the former pearling outpost of Broome. We'll enjoy a town tour, visiting the fascinating Japanese Cemetery and nearby Gantheaume Point. In the afternoon, we'll all relax with a drink while the sun sets over Cable Beach. (B,D)

Day 11

Today is yours to explore this tropical hideaway. Take an optional tour to Willie Creek pearl farm or visit the Malcolm Douglas croc farm or maybe just visit China town and the local pearl shops. Whatever your choice, it's your day. (B,D)

Day 12

This morning after a hearty breakfast, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight home, after a fantastic tour full of memories and new friendships. (B)

Kimberley Dreaming (Broome to Kununurra)

Explore the stunning scenery of Western Australia's popular Kimberley region. Massive boab trees dotting the landscape, rugged mountain ranges and long winding rivers will keep you mesmerized, and the variety of wildlife will keep your cameras clicking.

Day 1

Arrive in Broome where you are met by your Aussie Redback team. We have a town tour before you explore this pearling town. Shop for pearls in Chinatown; see dinosaur footprints and birdwatch in Roebuck Bay or you can stroll through the famous Broome streets, whatever you fancy, Broome will captivate you. Later we catch the amazing Broome sunset at Cable Beach. (D)

Day 2

We head towards Derby today and visit the Famous Prison Tree and town centre. Derby's claim to fame is having the highest tides of any Australian port. 11 m (36 feet) of tidal difference means there is an enormous amount of water rushing in and out every 6 hours. Derby calls itself the "Home of the Boab Tree". Boabs are used as street trees and give the town a special character. We check out the jetty before making our way to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 3

We make our way to the Gibb River Road, our first stop being Windjana Gorge. Windjana Gorge is a 3.5 km gorge, carved out of the Napier Range by the Lennard River. The walls on both sides of Windjana Gorge are 30 to 100 metres high, and the gorge is over 100 metres wide. We then travel to Tunnel Creek National Park which covers 91 hectares in the Napier Range. The main feature of the park is of course the 750-metre tunnel that a creek has worn through the Napier Range. The tunnel is the oldest cave system in Western Australia and although it can be explored, please note that it can be quite difficult climbing over the cave rocks, and water levels can be dangerously high at times. It is often closed due to weather conditions. Later we make our way to Fitzroy Crossing, after a wonderful day in the rugged Kimberley. (B,L)

Day 4

We start the day with a cruise at beautiful Geikie Gorge, then onto Halls Creek, a very significant place. It is the site of the first gold discovery in Western Australia and where the WA gold rushes began. In 1885 Charles Hall found a 28-ounce nugget. Men (very few women) soon streamed into the interior in search of their fortune. We stop on the way at Mary River, before arriving at this iconic town in the Kimberley. (B,D)

Day 5

On to Warmun for a morning tea stop and then we travel to the town of Kununurra, through spectacular scenery, situated in the heart of the Kimberley. We visit the diversion dam and the Old Ivanhoe Crossing. Later you have some free time in town before making our way to our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 6

After a delicious breakfast, we head to El Questro, stopping at Zebedee Springs for a revitalising dip in this amazing area of the Kimberley. Later we continue to Emma Gorge where you can enjoy lunch



and a hike for a swim. (This walk is not an easy one). In the afternoon we return to Kununurra. (B)

Day 7

We start the day with a fantastic cruise up the Ord River to Lake Argyle. We spot crocodiles and birdlife before reaching the dam wall which holds back the equivalent of 21 Sydney Harbour waters. We are met by our driver and taken to the lookout for a stunning view over the lake and Ord River. We visit the resort for lunch before a visit to the Iconic Durack Museum, later heading back to our accommodation. (B,D) Motel

Day 8

Today we take a tour to Wyndham, one of Western Australia's oldest towns. We will visit Five Rivers Lookout at the Bastions, followed by a tour of the old town. Later in the day we visit Parry's Lagoon, an oasis for birdlife and crocodiles, and The Grotto, soaking up the natural beauty of the Kimberley wilderness and what is a small, natural amphitheatre! (B,D)

Day 9

This morning there's an opportunity to fly over the Bungle Bungles. What a wonderful way to finish of this magical tour of the Kimberley. Later you are transferred to the airport for our flights home. After making new friends and falling in love with the Kimberley. (B)

Day 1

Fly into Darwin where you are met by your Aussie Redback Tours crew. We take an afternoon tour of the city before checking in to our accommodation and enjoying our first dinner together at the sailing club. (D)

Day 2

Today we explore Darwin, visiting the Military Museum and the Botanic Gardens, then free time in the city before a sunset dinner cruise on Darwin Harbour. (B,D)

Day 3

Travelling south on the Stuart Hwy today, we stop at Adelaide River’s War Cemetery. We continue via Katherine to Nitmiluk National Park for a tranquil cruise along the spectacular Katherine Gorge. Overnight in Katherine. (B)

Day 4

We start the day with a short drive to Mataranka for a swim in the thermal pools of this tropical paradise. Later we visit the “We of the Never Never” cemetery, before heading to the eccentric and iconic Daly Waters Pub. It is here we enjoy the nighttime entertainment and spend the night. (B)

Day 5

Today we head to Tennant Creek, an old gold mining town along the Stuart Highway. We also visit the wonderful Lake Mary Anne just outside Tennant Creek. (B,D)

Day 6

We enjoy a morning visit to Karlu Karlu (Devil’s Marbles). These gigantic boulders have become an internationally

recognised symbol of Australia’s outback. We continue to Alice Springs, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we visit amazing Ormiston Gorge, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed; and Ellery Creek Big Hole, which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. (B)

Day 8

On to Curtin Springs today, a 1-million-acre cattle property on Lasseter Hwy, visiting the lookouts of Mt Connor and Lake Amadeus along the way. Two-night stopover at Curtin Springs. (B,D)

Day 9

Today is all about the “Rock” and the “Olgas”. We enjoy an informative tour with our guide, then you can explore the Cultural Centre. You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to the “Rock” for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset in the evening. (B,D)

Day 10

Today, we continue to Kings Canyon in the Watarrka National Park. We take a walk into the gorge, marvelling at its breathtaking 100m high walls. Tonight, we’ll stay at Kings Creek Station (B,D) Note: Helicopter flight opportunity over Watarrka National Park (own expense).

Day 11

On to Coober Pedy today, one of the biggest towns in S.A, and home to 92% of Australia’s opals. People live underground to escape the summer heat, and many a film has been made here. (B,D)

Day 12

We spend the day in Coober Pedy, where you will have a chance to buy your very own opal during our town tour. Later we travel to the breakaways for pre-dinner drinks and nibbles whilst watching a magical sunset. (B)



Day 13

This morning we continue on the Stuart Highway with stops on the way at Lake Hart and Woomera. Woomera came into existence because of Britain’s defence requirements following World War II. Later we have an afternoon visit to the Matthew Flinders Lookout before arriving at our accommodation. (B,D)

Day 14

We begin our day with a journey back in time at the Wadlata Centre. We travel on to Port Pirie, where smelters have been in operation since 1889. We have a town tour and free time to explore this little town before heading to Adelaide. (B,D)

Day 15

We visit the Mount Lofty Summit to enjoy spectacular panoramic views across Adelaide’s city skyline to the coast, and then you will be transported to the airport for your flight home. (B)



Albany - Esperance

We visit the stunning beaches of Esperance (some say these are the best beaches in Australia), and the amazing south-west WA towns of Hopetoun, Bremer Bay and Albany, and on the way back to Perth we see the spectacular Wave Rock. Why not join us on this diverse seven-day getaway.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we travel the road less travelled to Albany. We visit Collie via the South-West Highway and enjoy a morning tea in this quaint little coal mining town. After that it's on to the country town of Boyup Brook. From here we will take the road through the Greater Kingston National Park to Franklin River, Rocky Gully and Albany, our home for two nights. (B,D)

Day 2

This morning we will visit some of Albany's attractions - firstly (Mt Clarence) the Desert Mounted Corps Memorial stands near the summit of Mount Clarence. We shall also visit the impressive Anzac Centre. The National Anzac Centre is dedicated solely to honouring the Anzacs of the First World War and is a must see at the Forts. In the afternoon we head to the Gap, which has undergone a major revamp at a cost of 5 million Later we return to our accommodation after an informative day in Albany. (B,D)

Day 3

Departing Albany, we make our way to Box Hill and Bremer Bay, situated near the Southern Ocean. This is our morning tea stop before heading to Jerramungup for lunch. In the afternoon we continue our journey to Hopetoun. This town was established

in 1900 as a coastal town servicing the Phillips River Mining District. We also visit the Fitzgerald National Park, with its beautiful views of our rugged coast. We settle into our accommodation for the night at this beautiful location. (B)

Day 4

Continuing our path this morning, it is a short drive through to Esperance, where our first stop will be at Cape Le Grand National Park. Beaches within the Park include those at Lucky Bay, Rossiter Bay, Hellfire Bay, Le Grande Beach, and Thistle Cove. Then on to our accommodation for a two-night stop over. (B,D)

Day 6

The township of Cunnamulla was created by Cobb & Co. on the third of September 1879. Today it is the only surviving south-west town along the original route. We visit and meet the "Fella from Cunnamulla", and later we travel to another iconic outback town of Charleville, our home for the night. (B,D)

Day 7

Blackall district was discovered in 1846 by explorer Major Thomas Mitchell and the township was gazetted in 1868. The local legend Jackie Howe earned his own statue in 1892 after shearing a record breaking 321 sheep by hand in 7.5 hours. If you've

never heard the saying 'beyond the black stump' then that is Blackall. On to Longreach for two nights. (B,D)

Day 8

Longreach is home to the Australian Stockman's Hall of Fame and Qantas Founders Museum. Later we enjoy the sights and sounds of the outback on this evening's riverboat adventure. Disembark at a campground where we continue our outback experience with a two-course stockman's dinner around the campfire. (B,D)

Day 9

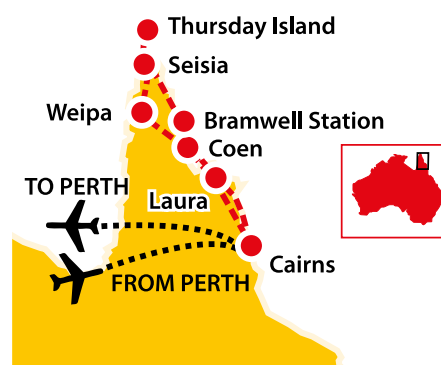

Day 3

Leaving Cairns today we head to Mt Surprise on the old Cairns to Forsyth Railway line. We visit Mount Garnet and Ravenshoe on the way before arriving at Mt Surprise, our home for the night. (B,D)

Day 4

We start the day with a tour of the Undara Lava Tubes which were created when the Undara Volcano erupted over 190,000 years ago, pouring out enough lava to fill Sydney Harbour three times over. In the afternoon we head back to our accommodation for a relaxing afternoon. (B,D)

Day 5

We travel to Hughenden, an outback artists' haven with a trail of sculptures installed around the town wearing its history and heart on its sleeve. We also visit Porcupine Gorge Lookout on the way to Winton for a two-night stopover (B)

A morning visit to the Age of Dinosaurs Centre, the world's largest collection of Australian dinosaur fossils. In the afternoon we visit the Waltzing Matilda Centre, followed by free time in Winton and



a wander of this classic outback Queensland town. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we continue to Boulia, home of the Min Min light on the "The Landsborough Way", stopping on the way at Middleton which made history in 1862 when the first white men, McKinlay and his search party for Burke and Wills, explored the area. Middleton later became the site of the Middleton Hotel and was a Cobb & Co changing station. Overnight Boulia. (B)

Day 8

Today we head for the Plenty Highway, through stunning outback country and arrive at Gemtree, our stop for the evening. (B,D)

Day 9

A later start today, we pass through the Harts, Jervois, Tarlton and Toko Ranges in the northern reaches of the Simpson Desert, arriving in Alice Springs early afternoon. (B,D)

Day 10

This morning we visit the old Telegraph Station and Simpson's Gap. You'll have the afternoon to relax and recharge the batteries before the next stage of our journey on the Great Central Road. (B)

Day 11

On to Curtin Springs on the Lasseter Highway and a look at this 1-million-acre cattle property, visiting the lookouts of Mt Connor and Lake Amadeus along the way. Two-night stopover at Curtin Springs. (B,D)

Day 12

Today is all about the Rock and the Olgas where we'll explore the area and visit the Cultural Centre. You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to the Rock for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset. (B,D)

Day 13

On to the Great Central Road in the Great Victoria Desert. This runs 1126km from Yulara to Laverton in WA, and we'll pass five small communities on the way. The Great Central Road has its origins in the early 1930s when Warburton was established as a missionary settlement, and supplies were delivered from Laverton via a rough bush track. We'll see a large variety of wildlife in the area – dingoes, emus, kangaroos and camels, and many species of birds. Overnight at Warburton in the Warburton Ranges. (B,D)

Day 14

We continue the Great Central Road towards Leonora, with a stop at Tjukayirla Roadhouse, deep in the Victoria Desert. It is one of the most remote roadhouses on the planet. We pass changing landscapes before arriving at our destination. (B,D)

Day 15

We start the day with a visit to the Gwalia Ghost town, a wonderful look into the past. In the afternoon it's on to Menzies and Kalgoorlie, our home for the night. (B,D)

Day 16

With the desert behind us we head to Perth, after conquering the famous Longest Short Cut. We travel to Coolgardie, Southern Cross and Merredin before arriving in Perth late in the afternoon. (B)

Visit Mount Augustus, one of the true wonders of Australia and the largest rock on the planet; and Walga Rock, a huge monolith where you can see the largest gallery of Aboriginal rock paintings in Western Australia.

Day 1

We start our adventure travelling through the Swan Valley on the Great Northern Hwy, arriving at Bindoon for morning tea. We continue through wheat and sheep country to Dalwallinu for lunch, then on to Payne's Find. On the sides of the road at this time of the year we should see carpets of everlasting. We head on to the outback town of Cue, our overnight stop. (D)

Day 2

This morning we take a short drive to Meekatharra before hitting the dirt road to Mt Augustus. We stop on the way at the Murchison River, a delightful area for bird life, flora and fauna. Our next stop is the heritage site of Mt Gould, site of one of WA's oldest police stations, built in 1880. We continue to Landor Racetrack where races have been held since

1929. After stretching our legs, we continue to our destination. Arriving at Mt Augustus Tourist Park for our two-night stopover. (B,D)

Day 3

This morning is all about the rock, Mt Augustus, and the lovely Lyons River and Cattle Pool, with its amazing large river gums, birdlife and animals – a perfect spot for morning tea. Around the rock we sight Aboriginal art, and amazing rock formations. The afternoon is yours to explore, relax and take in this vast area. Later we watch the sun go down on the largest rock in the world over champagne and nibbles, then dinner and laughs around a campfire. our two-night stopover. (B,L,D)

Day 2

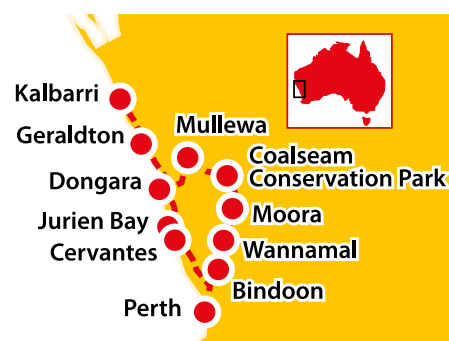

Day 3

After a visit to Geraldton's HMAS Sydney Memorial, we continue the Northwest Coastal Hwy to Binnu with a bush morning tea amongst the flowers, then via the Ajana Rd to Hawkes Head and Ross Graeme Lookout in Kalbarri National Park to walk amongst the coastal wildflowers of the area. Today we also visit Kalbarri's skywalk over the Murchison River Gorge, and Bluff Point. (B,D)

Great Central Road

Sun 13 to Tue 22 September 2026 – (10 Days)

The Great Central Road is part of the Outback Way route that crosses Australia. Get adventurous and take a red-direct trip from Alice Springs in the Northern Territory to Laverton in Western Australia. This is one of Australia's last great Outback adventure drives.

Day 1

Departing Perth, we begin our journey towards Kalgoorlie in the Goldfields of Western Australia along the Great Eastern Highway, stopping at Cunderdin's pump house museum, Southern Cross, and Coolgardie and its historic buildings. We arrive at our accommodation in Kalgoorlie. (D)

Day 2

This morning we take in the sights of this historic town, such as the Super Pit, truly an eye opener with its enormous mining production, Mt Charlotte, where water first arrived at the Goldfields in 1903. We then head towards Menzies, Gwalia (now a ghost town), and Leonora. (B)

Day 3

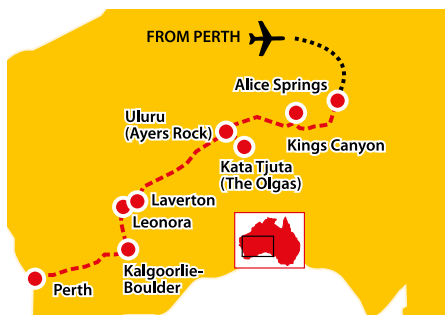
On to the Great Central Road in the Great Victoria Desert which runs 1126km from Laverton to Yulara in the Northern Territory. We will pass five small communities on the way. The Great Central Road has its origins in the early 1930s when Warburton was established as a missionary settlement, and supplies were delivered from Laverton via a rough bush track. We stop at Tjukayirla Roadhouse and on the way we'll see a large variety of wildlife in the area – including camels, and many species of birds. Later we arrive at Warburton, our overnight stay in the Warburton Ranges. (B,D)

Day 4

Onward into the Gibson Desert, where we visit the remote Giles weather station, named after Ernest Giles. We stop at the beautiful Schwerin Mural Crescent and visit one of Len Beadell's blazed trees, before reaching Docker River. Continuing on, we stop to have a look at the legendary Lasseters Cave before coming to the end of the Great Central Road. We catch glimpses of the Rock Uluru and the Olgas or in the distance. Tomorrow, we will visit both places and take in the history and beauty of the area, but for now it's off to our accommodation and a two night stop over. (B)

Day 5

Today is all about the "Rock" and the "Olgas". We enjoy a very informative tour with a local guide, and visit the Cultural Centre. You may also fly over both attractions (own expense), before heading back to



the "Rock" for a BBQ dinner and a spectacular sunset, later returning to Curtin Springs. (B,D)

Day 6

Today we visit Kings Canyon in the Watarrka National Park, which sits at the western end of the George Gill Range. We will take a walk into the Gorge, with its breathtaking 100-meter-high walls and then on to our accommodation and helicopter rides over the ranges (own expense). Later a beautiful sunset viewing over the Watarrka National Park. (B,D)

Day 7

Today we head to the "Alice". We visit the historic Telegraph Station and Anzac Hill lookout before having some free time in town. There is also an opportunity for a balloon flight tomorrow over the Ranges (own expense). Two-night stopover in Alice! (B,D)

Day 8

Today we visit the amazing Ormiston Gorge known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. Several waterholes attract native wildlife

and provide a beautiful setting for visitors. Later we visit Ellery Creek Big Hole, which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. (B)

Day 9

Today we will visit some of Alice's other amazing attractions. A morning visit to Altunga, an historic old goldmining town, now only ruins of its former heydays, we also have lunch at the old Altunga pub. Then on to Trephina Gorge Nature Park, known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums and sandy creek bed. Several waterholes attract native wildlife and provide a beautiful setting for bushwalking and picnicking. (B,D)

Day 10

This morning you will be transferred to the airport for your flights home, after this amazing tour of the Red Centre!! (B)
