Discover Albany, Denmark and Walpole as you experience the striking Natural Bridge and The Gap, then wander the crystal-clear beauty of Greens Pool and Elephant Rocks—some of the most breathtaking beaches in the region—blending refined comfort with the wild romance of the Great Southern.

### Day 1

Your great southern adventure begins as we leave Perth behind and journey towards the historic port city of Albany. After a relaxing lunch stop in town, prepare for a coastline carved by wind, waves and wild imagination. Stand atop Mount Clarence for sweeping ocean views before heading to the thunderous Southern Ocean where the spectacular The Gap and Natural Bridge showcase nature at its most dramatic. As evening settles in, we retreat to our accommodation with salty air still lingering in our hair. (D)

### Day 2

This morning we venture into the majestic Bluff Knoll region, where rugged peaks rise from the landscape like ancient stone guardians. Later, we continue to the breathtaking Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve, a place of turquoise waters, white sands and untamed beauty. The dazzling shores of Little Beach and Waterfall Beach feel almost unreal, with crystal-clear water that could rival a postcard from paradise. We return to Albany later in the day, hearts pleasantly windswept. (B,D)

### Day 3

After breakfast we travel west to the charming town of Denmark before arriving at the stunning coastline of William Bay National Park. Here, the calm turquoise waters of Greens Pool and the giant granite boulders of Elephant Rocks create one of the South West's most photographed natural playgrounds. After lunch in Walpole, we continue through towering forests to peaceful Fernhook Falls before visiting the historic timber town of Manjimup. (B,D)

### Day 4

Our final day begins gently with a scenic cruise along the tranquil Donnelly River, where forest reflections shimmer on the water and birdlife drifts quietly overhead. We then wind our way through the picturesque town of Bridgetown before stopping in Donnybrook for lunch. By late afternoon we arrive back in Perth, carrying home memories of wild coastlines, giant forests and the irresistible charm of Western Australia's south. (B)



# Northern Wildflowers

Escape into a kaleidoscope of colour on this unforgettable journey through Western Australia's wildflower country, where carpets of everlastings, rare native blooms and rugged coastal landscapes create scenes worthy of an artist's palette. From hidden bush tracks and rolling farmland to dramatic gorges and windswept ocean lookouts, this tour blends nature, history and country hospitality in perfect measure. Wander amongst delicate wreath flowers, discover charming heritage towns, marvel at sweeping coastal views and experience the magic of wildflower season at its dazzling best.

## Day 1

Our wildflower adventure begins as we travel north through the charming township of Bindoon and rolling pastoral country bursting with seasonal colour. At the historic old school site at Wannamal, we enjoy a peaceful bush walk surrounded by native wildflowers and birdsong. Continuing through the Mid West, we pause for lunch in Carnamah before travelling via Three Springs and Mingenew, stopping often to admire colourful roadside displays nature has thoughtfully arranged for us. By evening we arrive in the coastal city of Geraldton for a relaxing three-night stay. (D)

## Day 2

Today we journey to Mullewa, one of WA's most celebrated wildflower regions, where hillsides can erupt into dazzling colour during spring. We visit the scenic Hillside Lookout and explore one of the beautiful churches designed by the visionary priest-architect Monsignor John Hawes, whose distinctive buildings are scattered across the Mid West. Later, at Pindar, we search for the extraordinary Wreath Leschenaultia, a rare flower that grows in perfect circular wreaths upon the ground like nature's own botanical jewellery. In the afternoon we visit Coalseam Conservation Park, where fields of pink, yellow and white everlastings can transform the landscape into a living patchwork quilt. (B,D)

## Day 3

This morning begins with a moving visit to HMAS Sydney II Memorial, overlooking the Indian Ocean. We then follow the dramatic coastline north towards Binnu, stopping for bush morning tea amongst blooming wildflowers. Travelling along the scenic Ajana Road, we enter the spectacular landscapes of Kalbarri National Park where vibrant coastal wildflowers bloom against a backdrop of rugged cliffs and endless sky. We visit Ross Graham Lookout and Hawkes Head before experiencing the breathtaking Kalbarri Skywalk, suspended high above the ancient Murchison River Gorge. Later, we soak in sweeping ocean views at Bluff Point, where sea breezes and wildflowers combine beautifully. (B,D)

## Day 4

Our final day takes us south through the historic Lynton Convict Hiring Depot and the heritage town of Northampton before a relaxing morning tea stop at Port Denison. Continuing along the scenic Indian Ocean Drive, we visit the remarkable Mount Lesueur National Park, internationally recognised for its extraordinary diversity of wildflowers. After lunch in the seaside town of Jurien Bay, we make one final flower-filled stop at Nilgen Nature Reserve before returning to Perth late afternoon, pockets full of photographs and heads full of colour. (B)

## Mt Augustus Walga Rock at Wildflower Time

Fri 18 September to Tue 22 September 2026 – (5 days)

Discover the awe-inspiring majesty of Mount Augustus, one of Australia's great natural wonders and the world's largest monolith, rising from the outback like an ancient stone giant glowing red beneath endless skies. We also visit remarkable Walga Rock, a massive granite monolith rich in cultural significance, where you can view Western Australia's largest known gallery of Aboriginal rock art, quietly telling stories that have echoed across the landscape for thousands of years.

### Day 1

Our outback adventure begins as we leave Perth behind and journey through the picturesque Swan Valley along the historic Great Northern Highway. After morning tea in the country town of Bindoon, we continue north through endless wheat and sheep country, where wide horizons and open skies set the rhythm of the day. Lunch is enjoyed in Dalwallinu before we travel onwards via Paynes Find. At this time of year, the roadsides can burst into colour with dazzling carpets of everlasting, transforming the outback into a living painting. By evening we arrive in the historic gold mining town of Cue, our overnight stop beneath the stars. (D)

### Day 2

This morning we travel to Meekatharra before venturing onto the red dirt roads that lead deep into the heart of the outback and towards the mighty Mount Augustus. Along the way we pause beside the tranquil Murchison River, a haven for birdlife, native flora and peaceful reflections. We also visit the heritage ruins of Mount Gould Police Station, one of WA's oldest police stations dating back to 1880, where weathered stone walls whisper stories of the early frontier days. At the legendary Landor Racecourse, where races have been held since 1929, we stretch our legs and soak up a little authentic outback spirit before continuing to our destination. By late afternoon the immense silhouette of Mount Augustus rises before us as we arrive at our accommodation for a memorable two-night stay. (B,D)

### Day 3

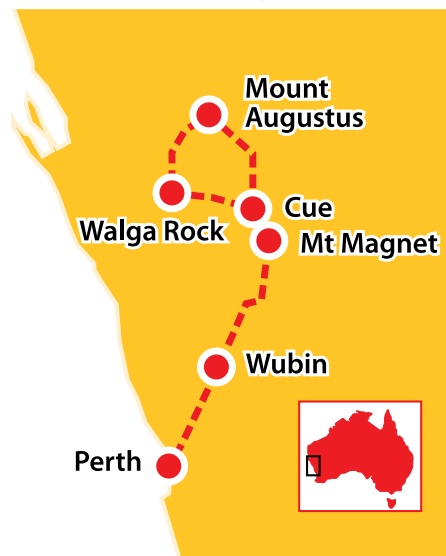
Today belongs to the giant. Rising dramatically from the surrounding plains, Mount Augustus is one of Australia's most extraordinary natural wonders and the largest monolith on Earth. We explore this ancient landscape, visiting the beautiful Lyons River and peaceful Cattle Pool, where magnificent river gums shelter birdlife and native animals. Morning tea here feels wonderfully timeless. Around the rock itself we discover fascinating Aboriginal rock art, rugged gorges and astonishing geological formations sculpted over millions of years. The afternoon is yours to relax, explore or simply absorb the silence and scale of the outback. As evening falls, we gather for sunset drinks and nibbles while the great rock glows fiery red beneath the fading light. Later, dinner and laughter around the campfire create the perfect ending to an unforgettable day beneath a sky crowded with stars. (B,L,D)

### Day 4

Farewell to Mount Augustus as we begin our journey south, travelling through landscapes rich in mining and pastoral history. We visit the haunting ruins of Big Bell, once a thriving gold mining town now reclaimed by the outback. Later we arrive at remarkable Walga Rock, Australia's second largest monolith. This immense granite formation stretches for kilometres and holds deep cultural significance, featuring one of Western Australia's most impressive collections of Aboriginal rock art hidden within its vast rock shelter. By late afternoon we return to the heritage town of Cue for our overnight stay. (B,D)

### Day 5

This morning we begin our journey back to Perth, travelling south through the ever-changing landscapes of the Mid West. Along the way we stop for morning tea and lunch, sharing stories and favourite moments from our outback escape before arriving back in Perth late afternoon, carrying memories of ancient rocks, endless skies and the timeless beauty of Western Australia's inland heart. (B)



## Esperance / Bremer Bay at Wildflower Time

**Discover the breathtaking beauty of Esperance, where powder-white beaches melt into impossibly turquoise water and rugged coastal scenery rivals anywhere on Earth. From sweeping ocean vistas to granite headlands sculpted by wind and waves, this spectacular region is a feast for the senses. We also visit charming Bremer Bay, a relaxed coastal paradise loved for its pristine beaches, rich marine life and untouched natural beauty. Whether you enjoy fishing, swimming, bushwalking, birdwatching or simply breathing in salty sea air while waves roll endlessly ashore, Bremer Bay captures the wild, carefree spirit of Western Australia's south coast.**

### Day 1

Our south coast adventure begins as we leave Perth behind and journey through the rolling countryside of Brookton towards the Wheatbelt town of Hyden. Here we discover the extraordinary Wave Rock, a giant granite wave frozen in stone that rises dramatically from the bushland. Nearby, the legendary Mulka's Cave reveals ancient Aboriginal handprints and fascinating local stories etched into the rock. With plenty of time to wander, photograph and soak in the atmosphere, this unique landscape offers endless inspiration beneath vast country skies. Overnight in Hyden. (D)

### Day 2

Today we travel south-east through changing landscapes towards the coastal beauty of Esperance and the breathtaking Cape Le Grand National Park. Prepare for beaches so dazzling they scarcely look real. We visit the world-famous Lucky Bay, known for its powdery white sand and turquoise waters, along with the spectacular bays and coves of Rossiter Bay, Hellfire Bay, Le Grand Beach and Thistle Cove. Granite peaks, crystal-clear water and endless coastal views make today feel like stepping into a postcard. (B,D)

### Day 3

This morning we cruise across the sparkling waters of the Recherche Archipelago on a scenic and informative journey to Woody Island, a peaceful nature reserve rich with birdlife, rugged scenery and island charm. After returning to town, enjoy some free time to browse, relax or simply watch the ocean shimmer along the foreshore. Later we enjoy a leisurely drive along Esperance's spectacular Great Ocean Drive, where sweeping coastal lookouts reveal one stunning view after another. We also stop at the famous Pink Lake, whose striking colours have fascinated visitors for generations. (B,D)

### Day 4

Today we venture into the remarkable Fitzgerald River National Park, one of Australia's most botanically significant national parks and a treasure chest of native wildflowers and dramatic coastal scenery. Rugged cliffs plunge into the Southern Ocean while colourful blooms scatter across the landscape like confetti from nature itself. Later we continue to beautiful Bremer Bay, a relaxed coastal haven renowned for pristine beaches, turquoise bays and marine life. During whale season, these magnificent giants are often seen cruising the coastline, adding a little extra magic to an already unforgettable day. (B,D)

### Day 5

Our journey home takes us through the rich farming country of the Great Southern, visiting the welcoming rural communities of Katanning and Wagin. In Wagin we meet the famous The Big Ram and explore the fascinating historical village, offering a glimpse into pioneering life in the region. Travelling onwards through Narrogin and back via Brookton, we arrive in Perth late afternoon with cameras full of coastal blues, granite wonders and unforgettable southern landscapes. (B)

## Stirling Range Southern Wildflowers

Wander through the spectacular landscapes of the Stirling Range National Park and WA's rugged southern coastline, where some of the state's most extraordinary wildflowers flourish in breathtaking natural surrounds. Discover delicate spider orchids hiding amongst the bushland, vibrant morning irises opening to the first light of day, striking swamp bottlebrush glowing with colour, and elegant painted ladies dancing across the landscape like tiny brushstrokes from nature itself. Framed by dramatic mountain ranges, windswept heathlands and the wild Southern Ocean, this tour is a celebration of colour, texture and the untamed beauty of Western Australia in bloom.



### Day 1

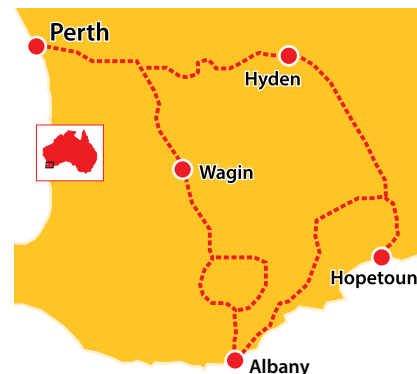
Our wildflower adventure begins as we leave Perth and journey south along the scenic Albany Highway, travelling through peaceful forest landscapes and rolling countryside alive with seasonal colour. Passing through the charming Wheatbelt town of Pingelly, we continue to the beautiful Boyagin Nature Reserve, a significant flora and fauna sanctuary where we pause for morning tea surrounded by native bushland and birdsong. By evening we arrive in Hyden, gateway to some of WA's most fascinating natural landscapes. (D)

### Day 2

Today we venture deeper into wildflower country, travelling to Newdegate, one of the Wheatbelt's best-kept botanical secrets where roadside displays can burst into vibrant colour during spring. Continuing through Lake King and Ravensthorpe, we arrive at the picturesque coastal town of Hopetoun. In the afternoon we explore the spectacular Fitzgerald River National Park, internationally recognised for its extraordinary biodiversity. Here, dramatic coastal cliffs, ancient mountain ranges and over 1,800 species of wildflowers combine to create one of Australia's most remarkable natural treasures. Overnight in Hopetoun. (B,D)

### Day 3

This morning we travel through Jerramungup and Boxwood Hill before entering the magnificent Stirling Range National Park. Rising dramatically from the surrounding plains, these ancient peaks are home to some of Western Australia's richest and most spectacular wildflower displays. We stop at the breathtaking Bluff Knoll, where rugged mountain scenery and sweeping views provide the perfect backdrop for discovering rare orchids, colourful heathlands and unique native plants found nowhere else on Earth. With more than 1,500 plant species flourishing here, the Stirling Ranges feel like a living botanical gallery beneath wide southern skies. By evening we arrive in the historic coastal city of Albany. (B,D)

### Day 4

Our final day begins in the beautiful Porongorup National Park, where we visit the fascinating Tree in the Rock, a remarkable natural curiosity tucked amongst ancient granite formations. Travelling onwards through Mount Barker and Kojonup, there is time to admire yet more native wildflowers flourishing across the Great Southern region. We continue through Williams before arriving back in Perth late afternoon, carrying home memories of mountain landscapes, coastal beauty and springtime colour at its most dazzling. (B)

### Day 1

Departing Perth, you will arrive in Hobart to be met by your crew and transferred to your accommodation. (D)

### Day 2

Today we visit Battery Point, Salamanca Markets, the Botanical Gardens and Mt Wellington (renowned for its amazing views of Hobart). Later we have free time in Hobart to wander at leisure, before returning to our motel. (B)

### Day 3

We travel to Port Arthur to learn all about this dreadful penal colony and most infamous prison. Later we visit Tasman's Arch, Hell's Kitchen, and Doo Town. The actual channel is between Macquarie Heads on the west and Entrance Island on the east (the main length of the harbour runs south-east of Hells Gates). (B,D)

### Day 4

This morning it is on to New Norfolk and the magnificent Mt Field National Park, location of the spectacular three-tiered Russell Falls. We also visit the Wall in the Wilderness sculpture which commemorates those who shaped the area's past and present. We also take a winding journey up to Lake St Clair and continue a scenic drive to Queenstown. (B,D)

### Day 5

Across to Strahan today for a Gordon River Cruise, where the wilderness comes to the water's edge. The cruise includes lunch on board and stops at Sarah Island where you can explore the ruins of the penal colony. (B,L)



### Day 6

We travel through Zeehan to the mining and hydroelectric towns of Rosebery and Tullah, then on to Cradle Mountain National Park. Once here you can meander through the forest and alpine heathlands on a purpose-built boardwalk. Later we take a short drive to Sheffield, home of over 60 murals, which will be our stop for the night. (B)

### Day 7

Today we visit Devonport, the southern terminus for the Spirit of Tasmania ferries. We also visit the Beaconsfield Mine and Heritage Centre, known for the 2006 Beaconsfield mining tragedy. We continue to Launceston, our home for two nights. (B,D)

### Day 8

Today we visit the historic town of Goerge town, it is Australia's 3rd oldest city behind only Hobart and Sydney. Later we also stop at Lilydale to take in the stunning waterfalls, then continue to Cataract Gorge before continuing to Launceston. (B,D)

### Day 9

Onto Legerwood today for a look at the Legerwood Carved Memorial Trees, but first a stop at Scottsdale. Later we walk along the avenue of trees and view the WW1 history on display. Next is the old tin town of Derby and then St Helens on George Bay, our home for the next two nights. (B,D)

### Day 10

Today we discover the breathtaking beauty of Wineglass Bay on an unforgettable 4.5-hour cruise along the spectacular Freycinet Peninsula. Departing from the tranquil waters of Coles Bay, we glide beneath towering pink granite cliffs, past secluded

coves and pristine beaches as we cruise towards the world-famous curve of Wineglass Bay. A delicious lunch is served as we soak in the magic of this extraordinary coastline. (B,L)

### Day 11

Our journey continues today as we travel to the beautiful village of Ross. Here we admire the remarkable Ross Bridge, famous for its intricate sandstone carvings crafted by convict stonemasons nearly two centuries ago. We continue to the charming heritage town of Oatlands before visiting historic Richmond, home to Australia's oldest bridge still in use and lined with beautifully preserved Georgian buildings. Later we travel south for our final evening together. (B,D)

### Day 12

This morning we bid farewell to beautiful Tasmania as you are transferred to the airport for your flight home, leaving with treasured memories of this remarkable island at the edge of the world. (B)



## WA's Coral Coast – Perth to Broome

Sun 18 April to Thu 29 April 2027 (12 days)

Discover some of the world's most diverse marine habitats just metres away from pristine beaches on the coast of WA.

### Day 1

Taking the Indian Ocean Drive out of Perth, we sight the sparkling Indian Ocean on our west. We travel through many cray fishing towns to Jurien Bay for morning tea and then on to Green Head, Leeman, and then Dongara for lunch. We also visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial overlooking Geraldton before settling into our accommodation for the night. (D)

### Day 2

On to the Kalbarri National Park where we visit Nature's Window and the Skywalk before returning to town. In the afternoon we visit the coastal gorges before returning to our accommodation. (B,D)

### Day 3

We return to the Northwest Coastal Highway where the country soon changes to open plains and sprawling sheep stations. Our journey continues to Carnarvon on the Gascoyne River, our stop for the night. (B,D)

### Day 4

Today we continue north to Coral Bay for a glass bottom boat cruise to view the striking coral of Ningaloo Reef before free time to snorkel or swim on the reef. A two-night stopover at Exmouth, the centre for the Navy Nor-West Cape Base and the Harold E Holt Communications Base. (B)

### Day 5

We travel to the head of the Gulf to take in the view from the Vlaming Lighthouse. Out on a glass bottom boat cruise to view the striking coral of Ningaloo Reef before continuing further down the Cape to Yardie Creek in the Cape Range National Park, a beautiful, rugged, iconic WA coastline. Time to relax in the afternoon by the pool. (B,D)

### Day 6

We head along the coast to Onslow. In the early settlement days, pearls were found in Exmouth Gulf and the town became home port to a fleet of pearling luggers. The town has been touched by cyclones over the years and even war in 1943, when a single Japanese plane reached here in World War II, bombing the airfield. Onslow has two lookouts located a short distance from one another, with both providing wonderful views of the ocean and the Mackerel Islands. (B,D)

### Day 7

Karratha was established in 1968 to accommodate the processing and exportation workforce of the



Hammersley Iron mining company and, in the 1980s, the petroleum and liquefied natural gas operations of the Northwest Shelf Venture, we visit these enormous operations as well as Red Dog memorial and the Burrup Rock Art site. Later we arrive at our accommodation for a two-night stopover in Dampier. (B,D)

### Day 8

Today we head to the old pearling town of Cossack with its once thriving pearling industry. We visit the port before exploring Port Samson. Later we return to our accommodation. (B)

### Day 9

A leisurely drive to Port Hedland today, stopping along the way for morning tea and lunch. Port Hedland is the second largest town in the Pilbara region of Western Australia; we visit the Old Port Hedland town and the Port to see the large-scale mining operations of the area. (B,D)

### Day 10

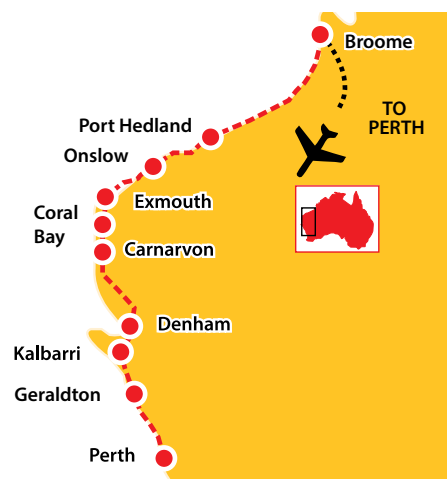
Today we travel through spectacular landscapes en route to the former pearling outpost of Broome. We will enjoy a town tour, visiting the fascinating Japanese Cemetery and nearby Gantheaume Point. In the afternoon, we'll relax with a drink while the sun sets over Cable Beach. (B,D)

### Day 11

Today is yours to explore this tropical hideaway. Take an optional tour to Willie Creek pearl farm or visit the Malcolm Douglas croc farm or just visit China town and the local pearl shops. Whatever your choice, it is your day. (B,D)

### Day 1

Today is all about Broome. We have a town tour before you explore this pearling town. Shop for pearls in Chinatown; see dinosaur footprints and birdwatch in Roebuck Bay or you can stroll through the famous Broome streets. Whatever you fancy, Broome will captivate you. Later we catch the amazing Broome sunset at Cable Beach. (D)

### Day 2

We head towards Derby today and visit the Famous Prison Tree and town centre. Derby's claim to fame is having the highest tides of any Australian port. 11 m (36 feet) of tidal difference means there is an enormous amount of water rushing in and out every 6 hours. Derby calls itself the "Home of the Boab Tree". Boabs are used as street trees and give the town a distinctive character. We check out the jetty before making our way to our accommodation. (B,D)

### Day 3

We make our way to the Gibb River Road, with our first stop being Windjana Gorge. This is a 3.5 km gorge, carved out of the Napier Range by the Lennard River. The walls on both sides of Windjana Gorge are 30 to 100 metres high, and the gorge is over 100 metres wide. We then travel to Tunnel Creek National Park which covers 91 hectares in the Napier Range. The main feature of the park is of course the 750-metre tunnel that a creek has worn through the Napier Range. The tunnel is the oldest cave system in Western Australia and although it can be explored, please note that it can be quite difficult climbing over the cave rocks, and water levels can be dangerously high at times. It is often closed due to weather conditions. Later we make our way to Fitzroy Crossing, after a wonderful day in the rugged Kimberley. (B,L)

### Day 4

We start the day with a picturesque cruise at Geikie Gorge, before continuing our journey to Halls Creek. Halls Creek is the site of the first gold discovery in Western Australia and where the WA gold rushes began. In 1885 Charles Hall found a 28-ounce nugget. Men (very few women) soon streamed into the interior in search of their fortune. We stop on the way at Mary River before arriving at this iconic town in the Kimberley. (B,D)

### Day 5

Onto Warmun for a morning tea stop and then we travel to the town of Kununurra, through spectacular scenery, situated in the heart of the Kimberley. We visit the diversion dam and the old Ivanhoe crossing, then later you have some free time in town before making our way to our accommodation. (B,D)

### Day 6

After a delicious breakfast, we head to El Questro, stopping at Zebedee Springs for a revitalising dip in this amazing area of the Kimberley. Later we continue to Emma Gorge where you can enjoy lunch



and a hike or swim. (This walk is not an easy one). In the afternoon we return to Kununurra. (B)

### Day 7

We start the day with a fantastic cruise up the Ord River to Lake Argyle. We spot crocodiles and birdlife before reaching the dam wall which holds back the equivalent of 21 Sydney Harbour waters. We are met by our driver and taken to the lookout for a stunning view over the lake and Ord River. We visit the resort for lunch before a visit to the iconic Durack Museum, later heading back to our accommodation.

(B,D) Motel

### Day 8

Today we take a tour to Wyndham, one of Western Australia's oldest towns. We will visit Five Rivers Lookout at the Bastions, followed by a tour of the town. Later in the day we visit Parry's Lagoon, an oasis for birdlife and crocodiles, and The Grotto, soaking up the natural beauty of the Kimberley wilderness and what is a small, natural amphitheatre! (B,D)

### Day 9

This morning you have the opportunity to fly over the Bungle Bungles (own expense). What a wonderful way to finish of this magical tour of the Kimberley. Later you are transferred to the airport for our flights home after making new friends and falling in love with the Kimberley. (B)

### Day 6

The township of Cunnamulla was created by Cobb & Co in 1879, when the first coach drove through from Bourke. Today it is the only surviving south-west town along the original route, and here we'll visit and meet the "Fella from Cunnamulla." Later we travel to another iconic outback town, Charleville, which is our home for the night. (B,D)

### Day 7

We visit Blackall today where the local legend Jackie Howe earned his own statue in 1892 after shearing a record breaking 321 sheep by hand in 7.5 hours. If you've never heard the saying 'beyond the black stump' then that is Blackall. Later we travel on to the

towns of Barcaldine and Longreach (our home for two nights). (B, D)

Founded in 1871 after the discovery of a gold nugget, Charters Towers was established as a place for prospectors to find their fortune in the gold fields. Over the next 36 years, they turned up over 200 tonnes of gold. This morning, we visit the Venus Gold Battery Museum to appreciate the town's rich history. We'll also visit Towers Hill Lookout and enjoy free time in town. (B)

### Day 11

Today we head to the East Coast and visit the towns of Townsville and Ingham on our way to Cairns. We spend time enjoying morning tea on the wonderful Strand, a 2.2 km boardwalk along the front of the Coral Sea, then continue to Ingham, a centre for the sugar industry and known as "Little Italy" due to its high Italian population. ### Day 9

On to Alice Springs where we visit the historic Telegraph Station and Anzac Hill Lookout before a visit to the stunning Simpson's Gap, returning via Honeymoon Gap, and ending with a well-earned rest at our accommodation. (B,D)

### Day 10

Today we visit the amazing Ormiston Gorge known for its sheer quartzite cliffs, red river gums, and sandy creek bed. Later we visit Ellery Creek Big Hole, which contains some of the most dramatic and beautiful countryside in the West MacDonnell Ranges. Return to Alice in the afternoon. (B)



### Day 11

We head north towards Aileron and Barrow Creek, stopping at the spectacular Devils Marbles where you'll have time to walk around these precariously balanced boulders. Our stop tonight is at the old gold mining town of Tennant Creek. (B,D)

### Day 13

A serene early morning cruise through Katherine Gorge in Nitmiluk National Park. Discover the cultural significance of the first two gorges to the traditional landowners, the Jawoyn people and keep an eye out for the resident crocodiles. (B,D)

### Day 14

Travelling south on the Stuart Hwy today, we stop at Adelaide River's poignant War Cemetery and the famous Adelaide River pub for lunch. Later in the afternoon we arrive in Darwin. (B,D)

### Day 15

Today we visit the Darwin Military Museum, stroll through the Darwin Botanic Gardens, and enjoy free time in the city before an afternoon sunset dinner cruise on Darwin Harbour. (B,D)

### Day 16

After breakfast this morning, you will be transferred to the Airport for your flight home. (B)

Litchfield National Park is a must see if you're in the Top End. It is home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into clear pools and iconic magnetic termite mounds.**

### Day 1

We fly to Darwin via Broome, where you are greeted by your Aussie Redback crew and transported to your accommodation for a meet and greet over dinner. A terrific way to start our Top End adventure. (D)

### Day 2

We travel to Litchfield National Park, a must-see if you are in the Top End. It is home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into clear pools, including the beautiful Wangi falls, where you can take a plunge. We also visit the Magnetic Termite Mounds, built by thousands of termites with a north-south orientation to control the temperature inside the mounds and to minimize exposure to the sun. We spend most of the day exploring the park, and tonight, we stay in Batchelor. (B,D)

### Day 3

This morning we travel to Adelaide River and visit one of Australia's most famous war cemeteries, a must-see. After morning tea, we enjoy a tour of WWII 4RSU Pell Airstrip, listed as a heritage site in NT. Later in the afternoon, we return to Batchelor, where you can visit Butterfly House and the museum, as well as explore the Batchelor townsite. (B,D)

### Day 4

On to Kakadu National Park, an enormous, biodiverse nature reserve in Australia's Northern Territory. Yellow Water Billabong is at the heart of Kakadu offering a remarkable journey through the region's wetlands, with its rich wildlife, dramatic scenery, and ever-

changing landscape. Later we visit Warradjan Aboriginal Cultural Centre, showing a mix of how the Aboriginals lived and used the land and how they care for the land. Later back to our accommodation. (B)

### Day 6

We travel back to Darwin today, stopping on the way to see various attractions, such as the Bark Hut Inn. Here is a REAL Aussie Roadhouse with the walls adorned by crocodiles and buffalo. This is a tourist icon and a must see on the way. We'll also visit Window on the Wetlands, a beautiful place to stop and view the birdlife from a higher view and interesting displays inside to learn about the Wetlands. This afternoon we will experience jumping crocodiles on a cruise on Adelaide River, finishing our day in Darwin. (B,D)

### Day 7

Our final day begins with a fascinating tour of tropical Darwin, where laid-back waterfront charm meets a rich and resilient wartime history. We visit the impressive Darwin Military Museum, uncovering stories of the city's pivotal role during World War II. Later, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight home to Perth, taking with you unforgettable memories of waterfalls, wetlands, ancient landscapes and the wild beauty of Australia's Top End.
